Program Description

- Established pursuant to S.L. 1996-18es2, Section 27.26
- Identify and eliminate discharges from straight pipes and failing septic systems to land surfaces and streams
- Varied funding sources including state appropriations

Examples

Program Accomplishments – 1997 to present

- Five survey projects conducted within first four years (projects are county or basin wide)
- 17 survey projects conducted since January 2002
 - Approximately 11,336 homes visited
 - 1,335 violations were identified

Program Accomplishments – 1997 to present

- New policy implemented in 2006
 - Allowed WaDE personnel to issue repair permits on behalf of the counties
 - Increased the rate that violations are corrected by 44 percent since 2006.
- Nearly 51 percent of all violations identified since 2002 have been corrected with many repair permits having been issued and awaiting system installation.

Program Accomplishments – 1997 to present



2006-2007 Program Overview

- Certified Intern Training (CIT) authorized agents of the state to assist counties with program and permitting.
- Limited to home revisits regarding existing violations
- Haywood Waterways Collaboration to address sedimentation, bank erosion, and bacteria with DEH, DWQ, DOT, Wildlife Resources, EPA, etc.
- Swannanoa River collaborative efforts and septic discharge in development
- Database and GIS update tracking and maintenance now in Asheville
