



"Fort Bragg created the gold standard of military conservation by addressing federally endangered species and encroachment around post, he said.

The partnership's efforts have been copied in various parts of the country, from different military installations in North Carolina to Hawaii.

Sixteen miles of Fort Bragg boundary also has been protected through the Sandhills Conservation Partnership's efforts, which has prevented encroachment on the post..."
