9	SECTION 1. The Joint Legislative Program Evaluation Oversight Committee shall

11	Assembly a study of the benefits that may result from the merger of public water systems and		
12	wastewater collection and treatment works. The Program Evaluation Division shall specifically		
13	include the following in the study:		
14	(1)	Consideration of whether the benefits that have resulted from the merge	r of
15		certain public water systems and certain wastewater collection and treatm	nent
16		works can be replicated for other systems. In considering this issue,	
17		Program Evaluation Division shall investigate the performance of	
18		Charlotte-Mecklenburg Utility Department, the Cape Fear Public Ut	ility
19		Authority, and Two Rivers Utilities.	
20	(2)	Whether the State can incentivize public water systems and wastew	
21		collection and treatment works that provide service that is afforda	
22		reliable, and in compliance with all applicable laws to purchase, intercon	
23		with, or enter into joint management agreements with public water syst	
24		and wastewater collection and treatment works that do not provide ser	vice
