REPORT TO THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS ON EXPENDITURES FROM THE SUPERFUND COST SHARE FUND FOR NORTH CAROLINA'S TEN PERCENT SHARE OF CLEANUPS FOR SITES ON THE NATIONAL PRIORITIES LIST

North Carolina has 34 hazardous waste sites on the National Priorities List (NPL) and one site is proposed for the NPL. Fifteen of the NPL sites are fund-financed sites, where no viable responsible parties have been identified. These sites are being cleaned up using a combination of federal and state public funds. The Hazardous Response Trust Fund (the Superfund) contributes 90 percent of the money for remedial actions at these sites and the state contributes the remaining 10 percent.

The state's 10 percent contribution comes from the Superfund Cost Share Fund (SCSF). As of December 31, 2010, the fund had accumulated \$16,466,810 in appropriations, interest and other income. Of that total, \$12,078,064 has been encumbered or disbursed to pay for the state's share of the cleanup costs at the fourteen NPL sites with signed Superfund State Contracts (SSCs). Other disbursements and reductions, including operations and maintenance costs, have removed \$1,591,743 from the SCSF, leaving \$2,797,003 available for future cleanup actions and long-term operation and maintenance. Planning for remedial action at one site, Ore Knob in Ashe County, is underway and some of the available funding may be obligated for this cleanup in the next few months. Preliminary estimates by EPA for Ore Knob remedial action are \$30 million. The North Carolina share would be \$3 million. An SSC has not been negotiated for Ore Knob and we have not received the official estimates. In addition to Ore Knob, other sites may be added to the NPL. Some of these sites may require a 10 percent state cost share for cleanup.

For Superfund-financed cleanups, CERCLA section 104(c)(3) requires the state to pay for the long-term operation and maintenance (O&M) of sites after they have been transferred to the state by EPA. The funds to perform O&M will come from the SCSF. The first site to come under the state's care is the FCX Statesville site. A sampling event at the FCX Statesville site was initiated in December 2010 and is presently underway. Since the previous report for May 31, 2010, \$6,315 has been used for operation and maintenance at the FCX Statesville site. The total cost for operation and maintenance since the work began in October 2009 is \$19,727. The annual cost estimate is \$30,000 and there are two sampling events planned for the site in FY2011.

Attached Table 1, Fund-Financed NPL Sites, lists the fourteen fund-financed sites for which State Superfund Contracts have been signed. The table also shows all encumbrances and disbursements that have occurred due to the state's 10 percent cost share requirement. Note that some sites are divided into Operable Units (OU). This is common practice in the cleanup of NPL sites, because it makes designing and executing the cleanups more structured and easier to control.

For the month of November 2010, \$98,300 was disbursed to EPA for the installation of water supply lines at the GMH Electronics site in Person County. Other than the payments for O&M at the FCX Statesville site discussed above, this was the only disbursement from the SCSF since the May 31, 2010 report.
