




- Local Funding (Smart Start)

 2000 Opened Dental Clinic in vacated dental office






- 2000 Patients and Payor Source






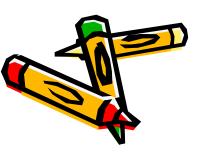
- September 2001

Children's Clinic



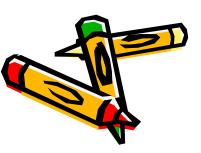






Adult Clinic











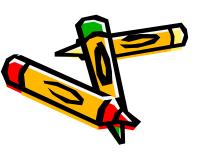
Back when...

- 1 Full Time Dentist
- 2 Assistants
- 1 Receptionist
- 1 Part Time Spanish Interpreter
- Approximately 30 patients seen/day



Now

- 6 Full Time Dentists
- 3.5 Dental Hygienists
- 11 Assistants
- 4.5 Receptionists
- 1.5 Spanish and French Interpreters
- 2 Full Time Administrative Staff
- Approximately 120 patients seen/day
- As of 2010 over 19,000 patients have been served




Positive Outcomes

- Primary Focus of Care changed from relieving pain to prevention
 - Reduction in Cost for Treatment
 - Fewer ED visits
- Percentage of Medicaid Recipients receiving dental care



Positive Outcomes

- In 2008-2009, 82% of 5th grade students had sealants.
 - This is the highest rate in the State!
- In 2007 50.3% of Medicaid children received dental care.
 - This is the highest rate in the State!
- Wilkes County has one of the highest rates of utilization of dental services among Medicaid Recipients, regardless of age.
