- 65 counties now under the b/c waiver
 - Cardinal Innovations (formerly PBH)
 - Western Highlands Network
 - ECBH
 - Smoky Mountain Center
 - Sandhills Center
 - Guilford County will be added under Sandhills in April 2013
 - This allows for transition and closure activities from the merger

Status of LME-MCO Transitions

- DHHS has issued final start date of Feb 1, 2013
- If LME is not prepared for 2/1/13 start date, DHHS will transition MCO functions to another LME-MCO
- DHHS & Mercer have studied and identified several contingencies plans for any LME area that is not prepared to go live 2/1/13



Innovations Plus (Innovations (c) waiver)

SESSION LAW 2011-264, HB 916

- Design the Innovations Waiver in such a way as to serve the maximum number of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities within <u>aggregate funding</u>
- ...the Department shall.... deploy a system for the <u>allocation of resources</u> based on the <u>reliable assessment</u> <u>of intensity of need (Supports Intensity Scale)</u>







Innovations Plus—Phase #1 Update (Standardized Assessment)

- Supports Intensity Scale (SIS) assessments have begun across the state
 - 850+ assessments have been completed so far
 - Each MCO area had 2-3 community trainings
- Results from SIS assessments are used for individual service planning now.





Innovations Plus—Phase #2 Update (Resource Allocation)

- HSRI will take results from a representative sample (5200+) of SIS assessments and develop a resource allocation model (a funding model) for NC (Fall 2013)
- HSRI and DHHS have traveled to each MCO site/stakeholder group to provide information, gain local input
 - MCOs will continue those local stakeholder groups as the resource allocation model develops
