

NCAnalytics: Data & Tools to Analyze Medicaid





NCAnalytics in Context

- Substantially more powerful and complex than its predecessor
- Provides a single source of data for analyses
- Data marts support normal end-user data needs
- Data warehouse supports specialized, complex analyses by power-users

Current Capabilities

- Data Warehouse
 - 10 years of data and current through March 2014
 - Financial information correct for category of service/account
 - Claims-based clinical and financial information available via request
 - Updated after each NCTracks checkwrite

• Advantage Suite & JSURS

- 6 years of data current through February
- Current through March by May 30, 2014 (2 month lag)
- Current through May by June 30, 2014 (normal 1 month lag)
- **Care Analyzer** Current, updated annually



Medicaid Data Analytics - Looking Ahead

- Complete outstanding financial data remediation issues
- Resolve outstanding issues within NCAnalytics affecting accurate, timely population of the data marts
- Leverage and expand existing investment and access to forecasting tools, technology and resources
 - SAS Forecast Studio and SAS Financial Management
 - Increase forecasting skills and workforce and access to worldclass expertise

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
NCTracks Highlights

- 98.84% of claims pay in 30 days
- 159 million claims paid since July 1
- \$8.1 billion paid to providers

- 5561 total severity 1 3 defects since go-live
 - 87% have been closed
 - No outstanding severity 1 defects



NCTracks Defects

- Significantly lower defect density than industry standard
 - Standard for projects greater than 10,000 function points is $\underline{1.67}$ defects per function point*
 - NCTracks is operating at <u>0.327</u> defects per function point as of March 5, 2014

NCTracks Challenges

- Operating as Designed
 - Crossover Claims Durable Medical Equipment rentals
 - Office Administrator function
 - Managed change requests



NCTracks Challenges

- Deferred Functionality
 - Eligibility/NCFAST
 - Going from a bi-weekly to weekly eligibility update beginning this weekend
 - DRG Grouper 30 and 31 (used by hospitals) back to July 2013 by April 30
 - Narcotic Lock-In Program
 - Targeting July 31 to complete



Provider Enrollment

- All providers (including attending) must enroll in NCTracks
- Added 11,920 providers since go-live
- Currently 97,377 providers are active in NCTracks
