#### Head Start and Pre-K

 Head Start is a vital partner to the North Carolina Pre-K Program, serving more than 3,700 at-risk 4year-olds.

 In SFY 13-14, federal sequestration reduced Head Start federal funding by 5.27%.

Impacts to Pre-K costs and slot availability.

#### Monthly NC Pre-K Rates by Facility Type

Facility Type	SFY 12-13	SFY 13-14
Private Child Care – Lead Teacher with Birth- Kindergarten License	\$650	\$650
Private Child Care – Lead Teacher with 4-Year Degree without Birth- Kindergarten License	\$600	\$600
Public Schools	Up to \$473	Up to \$473
Head Start	Up to \$300	Up to \$400



# NC Pre-K Children Served by Facility Type

Facility Type	SFY 12-13	SFY 13- 14	Change
Private Child Care	33.7%	35.6%	+1.9%
Public Schools	50.0%	50.3%	+0.3%
<b>Head Start</b>	16.3%	14.1%	-2.2%
