


Brains Develop Early

700 Synapses Formed per Second in the Early Years




Learning Starts Early

- Smart Start fundraising at all levels
 - FY 12-13 Smart Start leveraged an additional \$26.3
 million in cash and in-kind contributions
- Reaching more children to improve early literacy
 In 2012-2013:
 - 20,557 children participating Reach Out and Read
 - 555 classrooms participating in Raising a Reader
 - 51 medical offices participating in Reach Out and Read
