Implementation Update: Reductions to Children's Developmental Services Agencies

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## **Early Intervention Program**

- Serves infants and toddlers with significant developmental delay
- Services provided statewide through 16 CDSAs
- Served 19,914 infants and toddlers in 100 counties statewide (2012-13)



## **Early Intervention Outcomes**

- More than 70% make greater than expected progress
- More than 50% "catch up" with their age cohort
- Feedback from families is overwhelmingly positive



## Reductions to Children's Developmental Services Agencies, S.L. 2013-360


- 2013-2014 Reduction: \$8M, NR
  - 77 vacant positions
  - Contract/operating reductions
- 2014-2015 Reduction: \$10M, R, 160 FTE

- It does allow DPH to meet the requirement to eliminate 160 positions without significant service disruptions
- It does allow us to resource ECU to recreate large majority of positions
