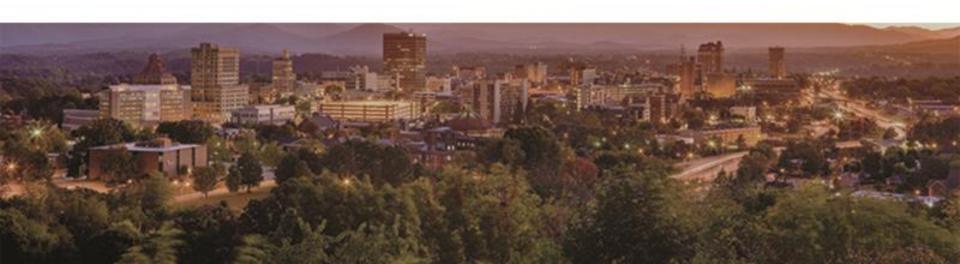




Progress: Medicaid reform

Proposed Local Management Entity - Managed Care Organizations (LME-MCOs)





NC FAST

- Exceeded FNS 95% timeliness goal in March
- Child Welfare ahead of schedule. Pilot summer of 2017
- Work First/Medicaid/FNS/Special Assistance/Refugee Assistance all in production and fully operational

Facilities

- Construction timelines for new facilities well below expectations
- Executed new pharmaceutical contract for drugs. Projected annualized savings of \$1.5 million
- Transition plan for ADATCs to a receipt-driven model submitted to the General Assembly
- Enhancing our ability to track and address patient safety in our facilities with new behavioral taxonomy software
