


2017-18 NC Influenza Season: Update



- Activity peaked week ending February 10th
- Higher peak than recent seasons

NC Influenza-Associated Deaths: 2017-18 Season



- Most deaths in persons ≥ 65 years of age
- Reporting lags behind other measures of flu activity
- Total deaths 342

Flu Messages

- Flu B continuing to circulate
- If you think you have the flu, call your doctor
 - Prescription antiviral drugs are important second line of defense
 - Especially important for those at high risk for complications
- Remember common sense prevention actions
 - Hand hygiene, respiratory etiquette
 - Stay home from school/work when sick

Cherokee County - Background

- DHHS learned that counties had been using these Custody and Visitation Agreements (CVAs). We began working with Cherokee County to facilitate child placement for these children.
- Use of CVAs circumvented required court involvement, a judge determined this violated parent's rights of custody and control of their children on March 14
- In the course of investigating use of the CVAs, DHHS determined that:
 - Cherokee DSS' child welfare services were not being provided in accordance with law, rule and policy and
 - Posed a substantial threat to the safety and well-being of children
- DHHS assumed temporary direct operation of Cherokee DSS' child welfare services on March 19

Collaboration with County Leadership

- DHHS informed Cherokee County leadership prior to initiating action to assume temporary responsibility of child welfare services
- County leadership expressed support for action, and DHHS has been working closely with County leadership throughout the process
- DHHS provided Cherokee County leadership with an initial assessment of child welfare services on March 30
- DHHS will work County leadership to develop a plan to return administration of child welfare services to Cherokee DSS upon completion of agreed upon steps for: training, staffing, oversight
- DHHS is committed to continued partnership and collaboration with County leadership
