Actions To Date

- On November 27, DHHS announced after consultation with JLOC:
 - Temporary takeover of all LME functions at Cardinal
 - Revocation of approval for board structure, requiring board be reconstituted by December 15
 - Expectation that Cardinal pay back \$3.8 million from administrative funds, based on salary paid
- On November 29, DHHS obtained a temporary restraining order (TRO) against the former CEO and former board members to prevent them from interfering in DHHS's management of Cardinal.

Appointment of New Board

- County Commissioners have primary responsibility for appointing new board members
- Board must have 11 to 21 members in 13 distinct categories
 - This includes 3 members appointed from Cardinal's Consumer & Family Advisory Committee (CFAC)
- DHHS worked with NC Association of County Commissioners on streamlined process:
 - Each county has appointed a member to a nominating committee
 - Individuals were able to nominate themselves or others to serve on the Cardinal board by providing a package of information to the nominating committee.
 - The nominating committee will meet this week and recommend a slate for the new board.
- To ensure stability for the organization, new board will be appointed by December 15

Next Steps

- DHHS staff remain on-site to oversee activities and help stabilize Cardinal
- New board must be formally appointed and trained in order to assume oversight responsibilities for the organization.
- Cardinal, working with DHHS, must develop a detailed corrective action plan in response to audits by Office of the State Auditor and the DHHS Office of Internal Audit.
- Key staff vacancies must be filled
