
### **Cardinal Innovations Update**

#### At the end of January 2018:

- DHHS transitioned leadership and governance to new board
- Corrective Action Plan adopted by board
- Committed \$3.8 Million from administrative allocation and other existing resources to fund community investment activities this fiscal year
  - High impact initiatives that will positively affect members and their communities over the next 12 months
    - Capital, equipment and/or programmatic needs
  - Transparent process
  - Board of Directors engagement in recommendations
  - Final oversight and approval by DHHS
- Cardinal retained outside counsel
- Court granted DHHS' motion for Preliminary Injunction against former Cardinal Board Members & Leadership

• Activity peaked during week ending February 10




- Higher peak than recent seasons

- Reporting lags behind other measures of flu activity
- Total deaths 200

## **Flu Vaccine Effectiveness: Interim Estimates**

- Overall effectiveness at 36%
  - Lower against H3N2, higher against other flu viruses
  - 59% effective for children 6 months-8 years
  - Similar to 2016-17 flu season (39% effective)
- Reduced risk of getting sick and having to go to the doctor for flu by about one-third
  - Best available way to prevent influenza illness and complications
  - Underscores need for better vaccines

# **Flu Messages**

- Not too late to get vaccinated
  - High levels of flu expected for coming weeks
  - Flu B tends to increase in spring
- If you think you have the flu, call your doctor
  - Prescription antiviral drugs are important second line of defense
  - Especially important for those at high risk for complications
- Remember common sense prevention actions
  - Hand hygiene, respiratory etiquette
  - Stay home from school/work when sick
