

Current Challenges for Children in Foster Care

- Chronic medical conditions
- Disruptions and delays in access to care due to frequent placement changes
- Multiple entities involved in their care
- Limited array of available community-based services to support placement in least restrictive setting possible
- Quality and coordination of access to services varies based on where a child's Medicaid originates.
- Children with complex physical and behavioral health needs have higher rates of care in restrictive settings
- Bifurcated system with limited focus on addressing unique challenges of children in foster care

Stakeholder Input on CFSP Design

Stakeholders have played an important role in shaping the CFSP design.



CFSP Plan Workgroup

Workgroup met on a regular basis from April 2021 through January 2022 to provide input and feedback on key areas of CFSP design. Certain features of the plan were revised based on this input.



Breakout Stakeholder Sessions

- Breakout sessions were held with:
 - Consumers and family advocates
 - Families and youth with lived experience
 - Family-led organizations
 - Guardians-ad-litem
 - EBCI Tribal representatives and members



DSS Engagement

DSS Directors, NCACDSS Executive Board and staff at both state and local DSS offices provided input to inform decision-making on CFSP design

In February 2022 DHHS released and solicited feedback on the CFSP policy approach

Children and Families Specialty Plan (CFSP)* Statewide Design

- Single accountable entity serving children, youth, and families no matter where they are in the state
- Individuals and families have choice of plan
- Plan focused on unique needs of children and families served by the child welfare system with emphasis on keeping families together
- Access to continuous services, maintain treatment plans and providers when children experience a change in placement
- Plan based care managers with training, experience and approach targeted to children and families in child welfare
- Plan requirements address county DSS offices' specific needs while promoting consistency in collaboration and coordination of health needs and colocation of CFSP staff in local offices
- Network adequacy standards tied to service needs of population
- Quality metrics focused on needs of children and families
