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## **Update on Settlements**

#### **Opioid settlements that NC is party to:**

- McKinsey
- Cardinal Health, Amerisource Bergen, McKesson, and Johnson & Johnson, often referred to as the "Settlement"

## **Update on Settlements**

#### **McKinsey**

- NCGA appropriated into an Opioid Abatement fund to:
  - Expand employment and transportation supports
  - Implement programs in jails and prisons
  - Expand evidence-based treatment supports and to improve connections to care
  - Support evidence-based supportive housing services
- In alignment with language, DHHS will competitively award funds for the specified purpose

## **Update on Settlements**

- Cardinal Health, Amerisource Bergen, McKesson, and Johnson & Johnson Settlement:
  - Requires 85% of funding go directly to counties to combat the opioid epidemic
  - Federal requirement that funds be used for opioid abatement activities from a federally specified menu of options. Counties can request ability to offer unique programs
  - NCDHHS will be providing training and technical assistance to the counties
  - NCDHHS is partnering with NC Association of County Commissioners and Attorney General's office
  - Counties will supply data on overdoses, treatment access and current programs through the NC Opioid and Substance Action Plan dashboard
