Inventory of Health Care Facilities and Services

- Inpatient psychiatric bed inventory updated annually in the N.C. State Medical Facilities Plan (SMFP)
- Inventory data from the Division of Health Service Regulation's (DHSR) databases
- Utilization of services and patient origin data
 - License renewal applications & Truven Health Analytics
 - Data submitted by health care providers (acute care hospitals and free-standing mental health hospitals)

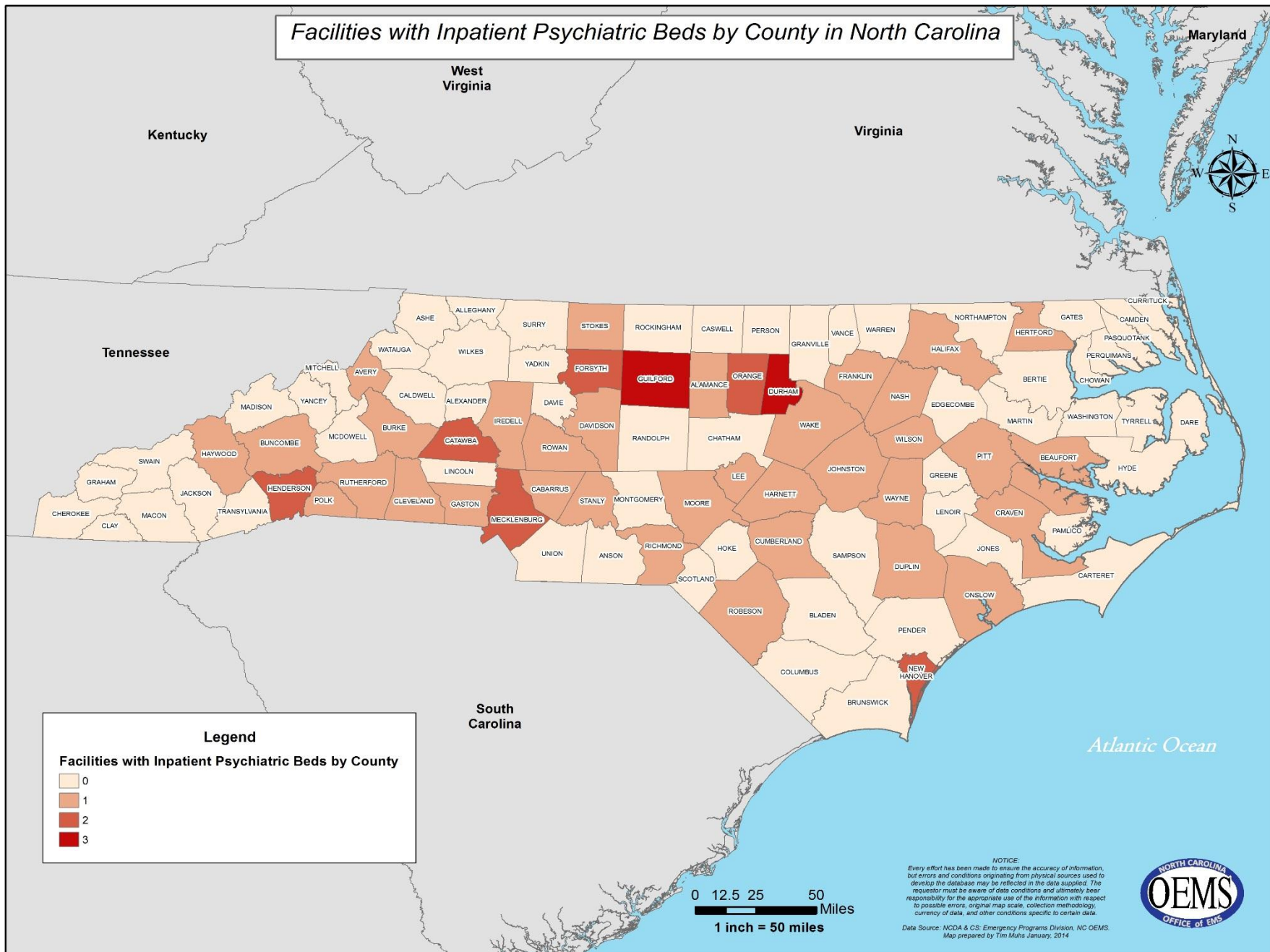
Inpatient Psychiatric Beds Governed by SMFP

- Beds licensed under 10A NCAC 27G .6000
- These beds provide
 - 24-hour treatment in an inpatient hospital setting
 - treatment for individuals who have acute psychiatric problems or substance abuse disorders
 - the most intensive and restrictive type of facility for individuals
- Beds housed in state-operated facilities are not licensed by DHHS

Inpatient Psychiatric Beds

- Non-state operated care settings
 - 6 free-standing psychiatric hospitals
 - 45 general acute care hospitals with designated psychiatric units
- 1,878 licensed, non-state operated beds

Child/Adolescent Bed Need Determinations

- In 2014, 72 inpatient beds were projected to be needed across the state.
- In 2013, 42 inpatient beds were projected to be needed.

Adult Inpatient Psychiatric Beds

<u>Year</u>	<u>Licensed Beds</u>
1990	1,757
2000	1,555
2010	1,389
2013	1,587

- 366,572 days of care provided in these beds in 2012

Adult Bed Need Determinations

- In 2014, 57 inpatient beds needed across the state, as determined by the standard methodology.
- The State Health Coordinating Council also approved a special need determination for 25 beds dedicated to the treatment of adult eating disorder patients across the state.
- In 2013, 30 inpatient beds were needed.

PSY-1 Policy

- Adopted in its current form in 1997
- Transfer of beds from state psychiatric hospitals to community facilities through the Certificate of Need process
- CONs have been issued for the transfer of 278 beds under this policy
 - 206 adult beds
 - 72 child/adolescent
