- Continued reliance on county DSSs




DAAS Contract Addresses Conflict of Interest Protections Cited in 35A-1213

Prohibits individual who contracts with or is employed by an entity that contracts with a local management entity (LME) for the delivery of mental health, developmental disabilities, and substance abuse services from serving as a guardian for a ward for whom the individual or entity is providing these services, unless the individual is a parent of that ward.




Face of NC Public Guardianship






Expected Growth
