### Notes:

\*These are the various sources of state funding to the SOM. State funding to the SOM is focused on medical school teaching, which a future doctor must complete before residency. There were 735 MD students enrolled in fall FY16. Graduate medical education (residency) occurs after medical school graduation and is typically funded by the federal government through CMS, or funded by UNC SOM departments (using clinical dollars) and UNC Health Care. At UNC Health Care about half of our 800 residency training slots are funded by CMS and the other half are funded through clinical income by the departments or health care system.

\*UNC SOM also educates PhDs who will spend their careers focused on research. This is listed as "Graduate Tuition" but is not related to training resident physicians. There were over 330 graduate students enrolled in fall FY16.

\*Allied Health tuition supports our programs in physical therapy, occupational therapy, and other allied health programs. There were over 400 Allied Health students enrolled in fall FY16, excluding the new PA program.

\*SOM state appropriation funding is not allocated for GME. It is utilized for medical student education, including on our branch campuses in Asheville, Charlotte, and Wilmington. PhD student education is also included in this state appropriation.

\*Line-item allocations are not supporting GME.
