PED North Carolina Accountability Report (NCAR) Identified Multiple Issues

- DPI Delegated Program Design and Operation to Local Education Authorities
- DPI and State Board of Education Had Not Adopted and Distributed a Standardized Driver Education Curriculum
- DPI Had Not Established a Strategic Plan or Performance Metrics for Driver Education
- DPI Conducted No Technical Oversight and Only Limited Cost Analysis

Actions Required of the Department of Public Instruction by Legislation

- Organize and Implement Standardized Driver Education <u>Curriculum</u> Offered by Local Education Authorities
- State Board of Education shall establish and Implement a <u>Strategic Plan</u> for the Driver Education Program
- Establish an <u>Advisory Committee</u> for Driver Education Program
- State Board of Education shall Establish a <u>Pilot Program to</u> <u>Deliver Driver Education by Electronic Means</u>
- Report the Most Cost-Effective Method for Delivering Driver Education in the Short and Long-Term



DPI Reported Actions as of June 15, 2012

- Had developed, adopted, revised and distributed Standardized Driver Education Curriculum to Local Education Authorities
- Appointed Driver Education Advisory Committee As Part of the Team Developing the Driver Education Strategic Plan
- Completed Draft Strategic Plan
- Conducted On-line Pilot Program; DPI to Submit Complete Report at Later Date
- Report on Most Cost-Effective Method for Delivering Driver Education Reports at Later Date
