

## Bill Draft 2017-MKz-184: Principal Preparation Program Changes.

OVERVIEW: 2017-MKz-184 makes changes to the reporting requirements for the Transforming Principal Preparation Program to add additional data to be included in annual reports, including allowing for the evaluation of (i) program success in placing school leaders in high-need schools and (ii) long-term outcomes from the program. The State Education Assistance Authority (Authority) is also added to the entities to which a nonprofit corporation administering the program shall report annually and directs the Authority to include the required annual report as a term of contract with the nonprofit corporation.

**BILL ANALYSIS:** 2017-MKz-184 provides that a nonprofit corporation administering the Transforming Principal Preparation Program shall enable collection, analysis, and evaluation of additional relevant data from grant recipients as part of its annual report to the State Board of Education, the Authority, and the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee. The act also reorganizes existing data requirements related to long-term outcomes to align with the timing of the reports set forth in the amended provision. For the annual report due by July 31, 2018, the nonprofit will be required to include detailed data in the report on candidates participating in the program, as well as data on the current requirement related to the performance evaluations of program completers. For the annual report due by July 31, 2019, the nonprofit will be required to also include data in the report on the change over time of program participants' leadership skills and commitment. For the annual report due by July 31, 2021, the nonprofit will be required to also include data in the report on the implementation of best practices learned from the program at the State level and for other grant recipients, the satisfaction of employers of graduates of the program, the placement of school leaders in high-need schools and the employment of school leaders in those schools for two or more years, and the current requirements related to placement of program completers within three years in the State and those who remain employed for two or more years after the initial placement. Each subsequent annual report submitted by the nonprofit corporation must include all of the data listed in the provision.

The act also requires that, prior to the allocation of funds for the Transforming Principal Preparation Program each fiscal year, the Authority shall ensure that the contract with the nonprofit corporation administering the program shall include the requirement that the nonprofit submit the annual reports required by the provision.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This act is effective July 1, 2018, and applies to required reports submitted by the nonprofit corporation on or after that date.

"SECTION 11.9.(k) Licensure Process. – By June 1, 2016, the State Board of Education shall adopt a policy to provide for a specific licensure process applicable to school administrators who provide documentation to the State Board of successful completion of a principal preparation program selected for a competitive grant in accordance with this section. Licensure shall include a requirement for candidates to hold a master's degree.

"SECTION 11.9.(1) Evaluation and Revision of Program. – The nonprofit corporation administering the program shall provide the State Board of Education Education, the Authority, and the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee with the data collected in accordance with subsection (j) of this section on an annual basis. Prior to the allocation of funds for the program each fiscal year, the Authority shall ensure that as a term of the contract with the nonprofit corporation that the nonprofit shall submit an annual report to the Authority in accordance with this section.

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Governors of The University of North Carolina, shall revise, as necessary, the licensure requirements for school administrators and the standards for approval of school administrator preparation programs after evaluating the data collected from the grant recipients, including the criteria used in selecting grant recipients and the outcomes of program completers. The State Board of Education shall report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee by November 15, 2021, on any changes made to the licensure requirements for school administrators and the standards for approval of school administrator preparation programs in accordance with this section.

 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2018, and applies beginning with any reports submitted by the nonprofit corporation pursuant to Section 11.9 of S.L. 2015-241, as amended, on or after that date.
