

Bill Draft 2019-PBz-1: Teacher Diversity/PED Recommendations.

OVERVIEW: Draft 2019-PBz-1 would direct the State Board of Education to develop an alternative plan and consider alternative qualifications for teachers to receive a continuing professional license and direct the North Carolina Teaching Fellows Commission to select at least one minority-serving institution to participate in the North Carolina Teaching Fellows Program, as recommended by a Program Evaluation Division report.

BILL ANALYSIS: Bill Draft 2019-PBz-1 would do the following:

- Section 1 would require the State Board of Education, in consultation with the Department of Public Instruction and the Professional Educator Preparation and Standards Commission (PEPSC), to do the following:
 - Develop an alternative plan for applicants seeking a continuing professional license who have not met the prescribed minimum score, pursuant to G.S. 115C-270.15, to receive a continuing professional license.
 - Identify (i) the potential effects of the plan on the diversity and effectiveness of the teacher workforce, (ii) the benefits and challenges of implementing the plan, and (iii) all cost associated with implementation of the plan.
 - Consider alternative qualifications for applicants to receive a continuing professional license.
 - Submit the plan to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee by October 1, 2021.
- Section 2 would require the Teaching Fellows Commission to select at least one minorityserving institution to participate in the North Carolina Teaching Fellows Program by October 1, 2021.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill would be effective when it becomes law. Section 2 would apply beginning with the 2022-2023 academic year.

13	license who have not met the prescribed minimum score on the standardized exams required,
14	pursuant to G.S. 115C-270.15, to receive a continuing professional license. The plan shall
15	identify, at a minimum, the following criteria: (i) the potential effects of the plan on the diversity
16	and effectiveness of the teacher workforce, (ii) the benefits and challenges of implementing the
17	plan, and (iii) all cost associated with implementation of the plan.
18	SECTION 1.(b) The State Board of Education shall consider the following
19	alternative qualifications for the applicant to receive a continuing professional license when
20	developing the plan described in subsection (a) of this section:
21	(1) A recommendation from the superintendent of the local school administrative
22	unit where the applicant is seeking licensure.
23 24	(2) An evaluation rating of proficient or above for each year of the teacher's initial
24 25	licensure. SECTION 1.(c) The State Board of Education shall submit the plan described in
23 26	subsection (a) of this section to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee no later
20	than October 1, 2021, and include any recommendations for legislation necessary to implement

29	SECTION 2.(a) G.S. 116-209.62(f) reads as rewritten:
30	"(f) Program Selection Criteria. – The Authority shall administer the Program in
31	cooperation with up to eight institutions of higher education with approved educator preparation
32	programs selected by the Commission that represent a diverse selection of both postsecondary
33	constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina and private postsecondary
34	institutions operating in the State. The Commission shall select at least one minority-serving
