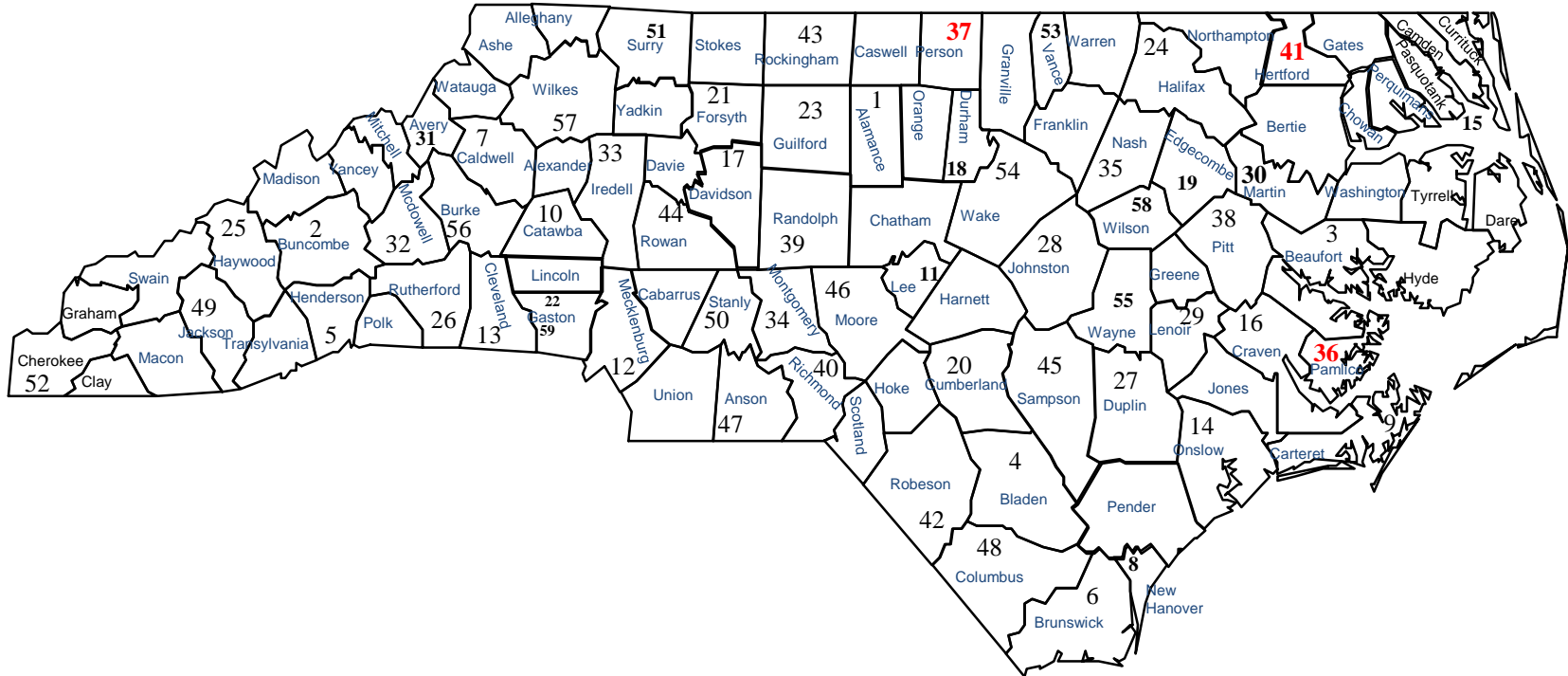

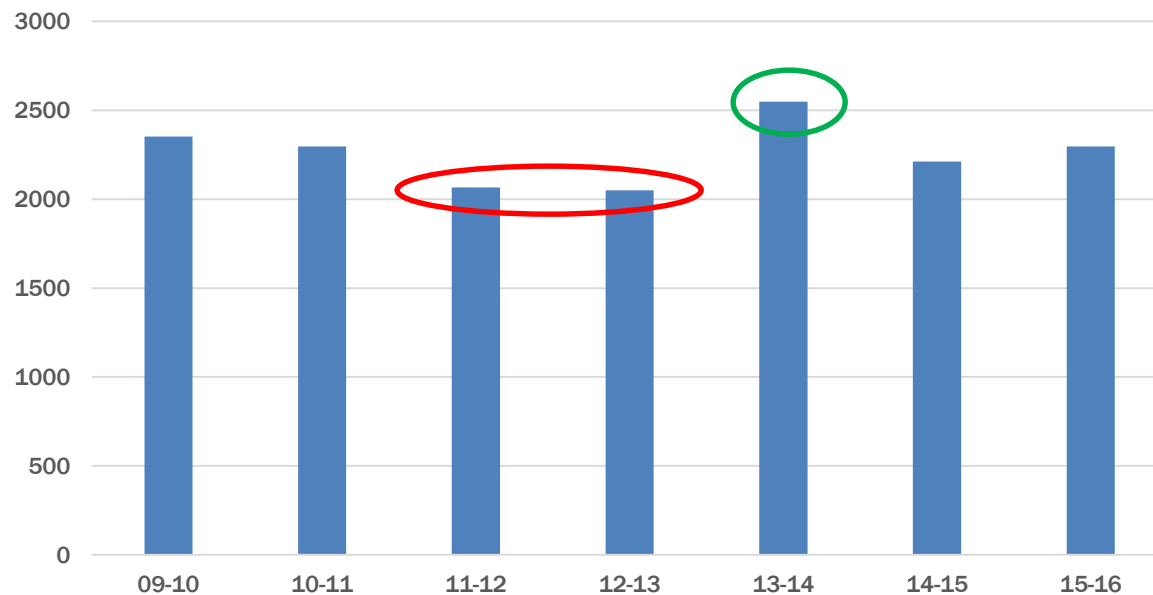

Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET)

- **Follow DOJ Education Training and Standards requirements**
 - Faculty
 - School Director
 - NC Justice Academy Curriculum
 - designed to prepare entry-level individuals with the cognitive and physical skills needed to become certified law enforcement officers in North Carolina
 - 36 Blocks
 - 620 hours
 - Admission Requirements

Enrollment Trends

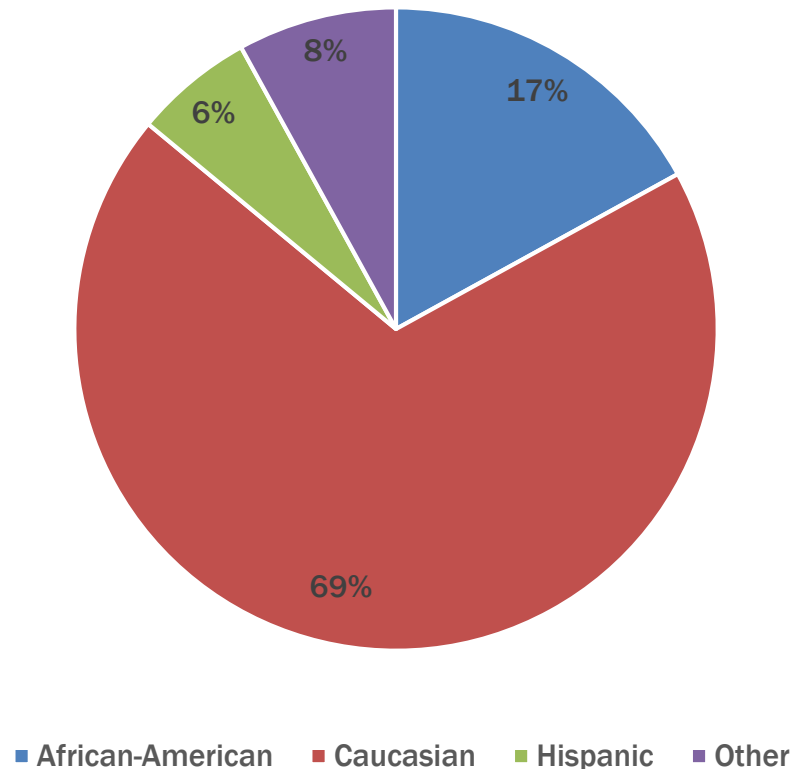
- **Urban**

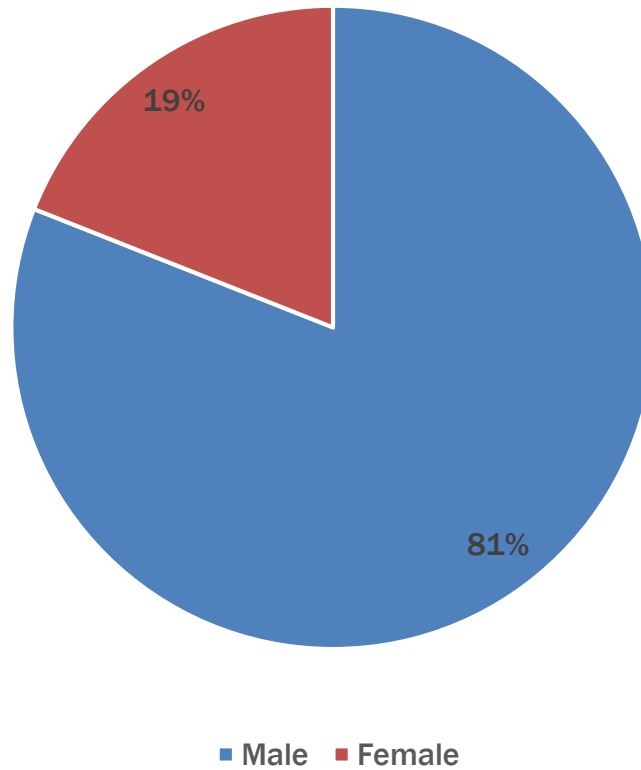
2015 NCCCS BLET Student Demographics

Ethnicity



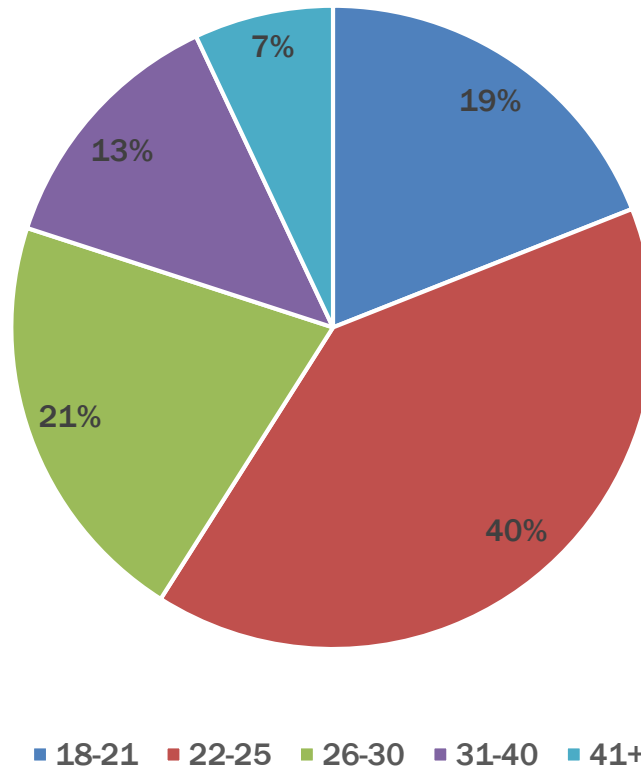
2015 NCCCS BLET Student Demographics
