Enhancing awareness and improved screening increased the percentage of offenders served


2008 (9.8%) 2016 (15.15%)

Goal: Activate all prior to December 2016 with 75% capacity.

As of today 25% of TDU beds are occupied!

Plan: Activate four additional Therapeutic Diversion Units in 2017











Staffing: 92% staffing success on the TDUs

All TDUs staff will complete ACA Correctional Behavioral Health Certification in addition to Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training.

- 52 staff have completed ACA training
- ▶ 52 staff scheduled for ACA training in October 2016
- All have completed CIT training

▶ NEW Mental Health Training!

- (H) Heighten awareness regarding signs and symptoms
- (O) Observe and Listen to Offender
- (P) Provide Support to Offender
- (E) Encourage professional help & provide offender with selfhelp strategies
