- 14 Board members: the Secretary of Public Safety (or designee); 3
 persons appointed by the Governor; 10 persons appointed by the
 General Assembly
- Six two-day meetings annually
- Evaluates grievances against licensees
- Administers licensing, registration, and training requirements for:
 - Private investigators
 - Security guards (armed and unarmed)
 - Armored car profession
 - Courier service

- Guard dog service profession
- Electronic countermeasures profession
- Polygraph examiners
- Psychological stress examiners


Private Protective Services

- 48,000+ annual telephone call volume


Department of Public Safety





Current Private Protective Services Licensees




Alarm Systems Licensing Board (ASLB)

- Evaluates grievances against licensees


