Private Protective Services Board (PPSB)

- Operates pursuant to the Private Protective Services Act (NCGS 74C)
- 14 Board members: the Secretary of Public Safety (or designee); 3 persons appointed by the Governor; 10 persons appointed by the General Assembly
- Six two-day meetings annually
- Evaluates grievances against licensees
- Administers licensing, registration, and training requirements for:
 - Private investigators
 - Security guards (armed and unarmed)
 - Armored car profession
 - Courier service
 - Guard dog service profession
 - Electronic countermeasures profession
 - Polygraph examiners
 - Psychological stress examiners

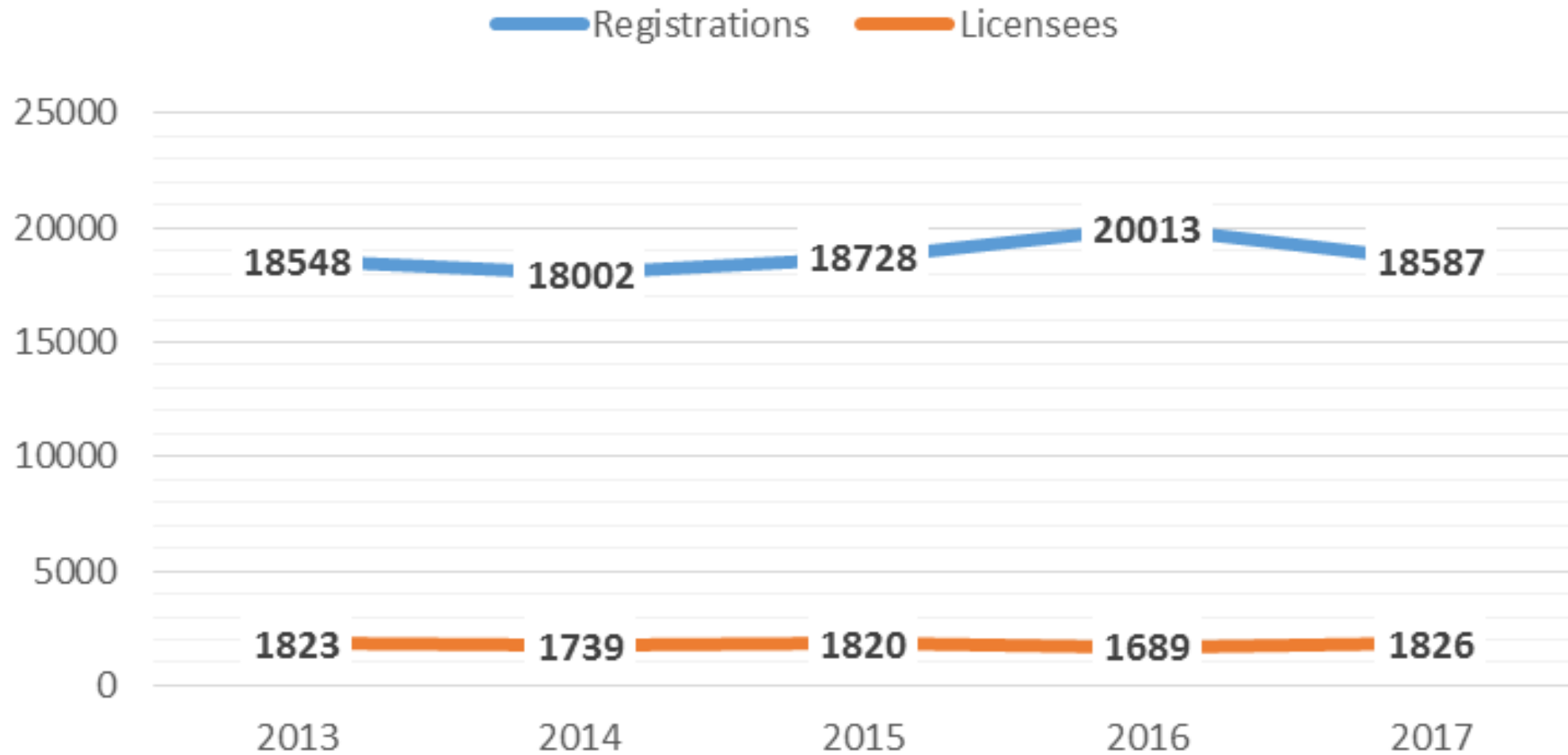
Private Protective Services

- Provides support for Alarms Systems Licensing Board (ASLB) and Private Protective Services Board (PPSB)
- 22 State employees
 - 8 registration positions
 - 8 field services positions
 - 3 licensing positions
 - 3 administrative positions
- 48,000+ annual telephone call volume

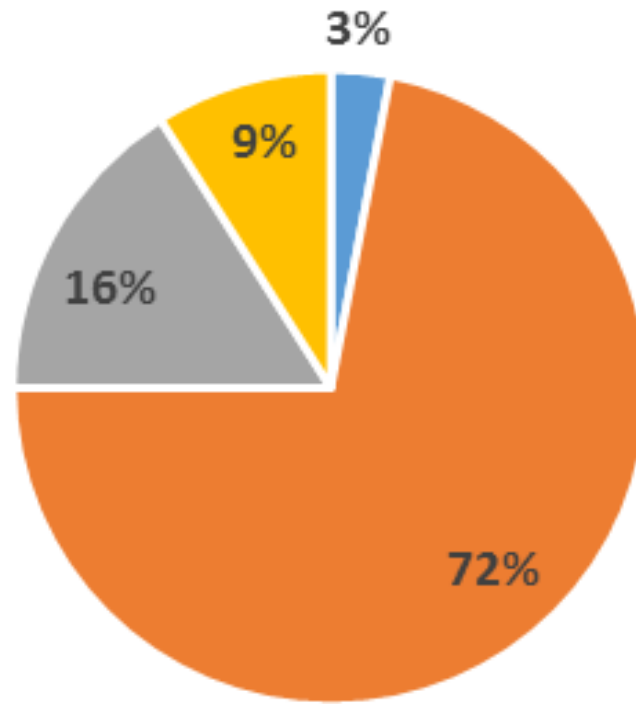
Department of Public Safety

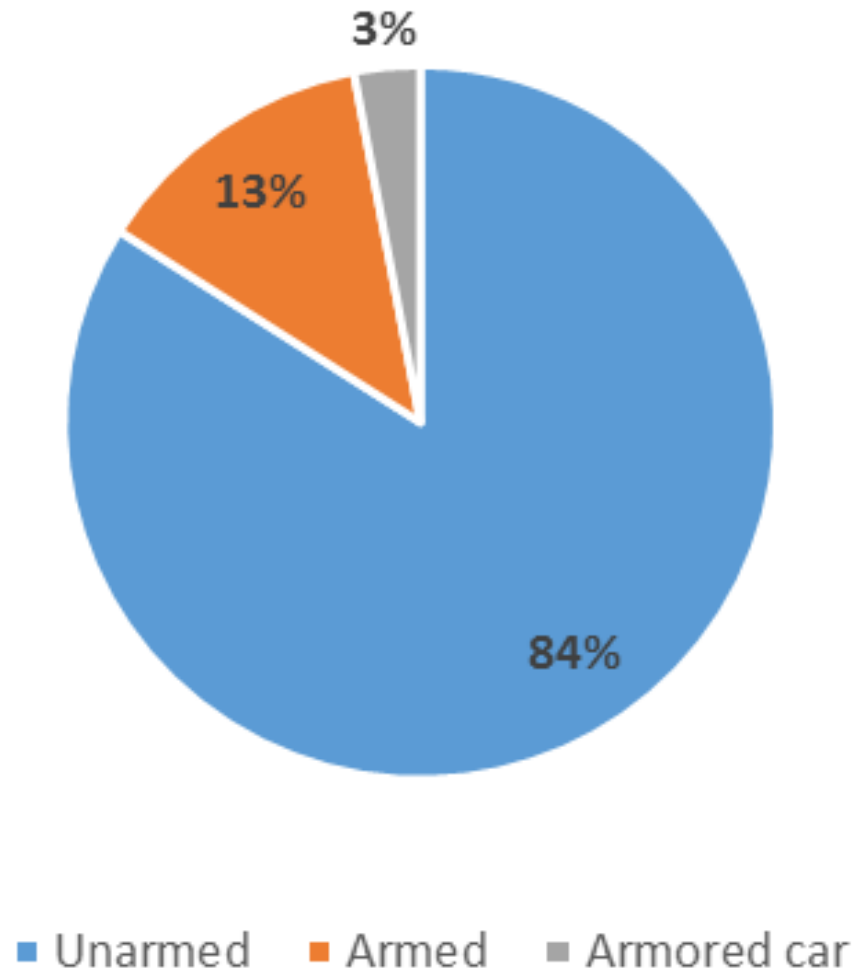


Current Private Protective Services Licensees

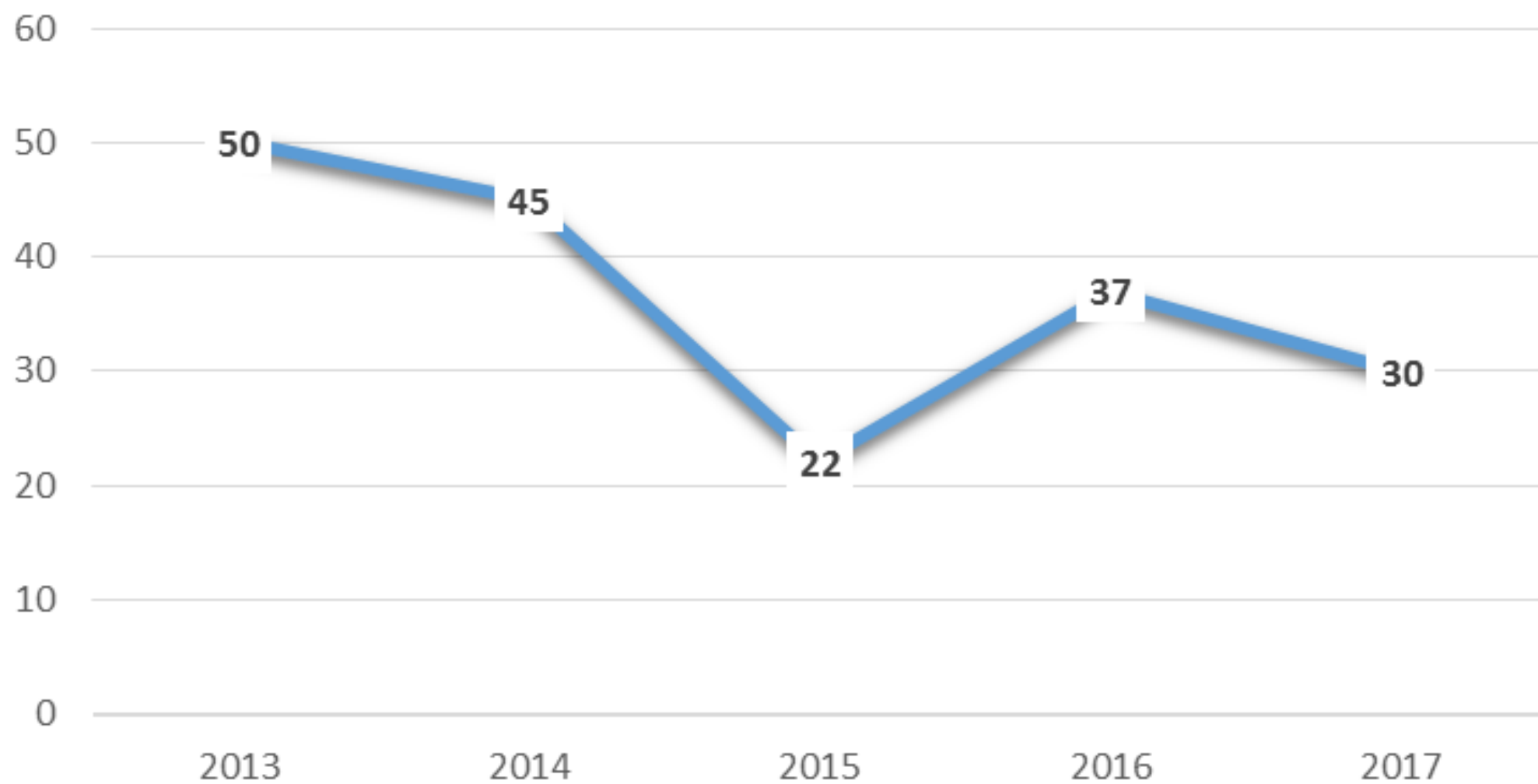


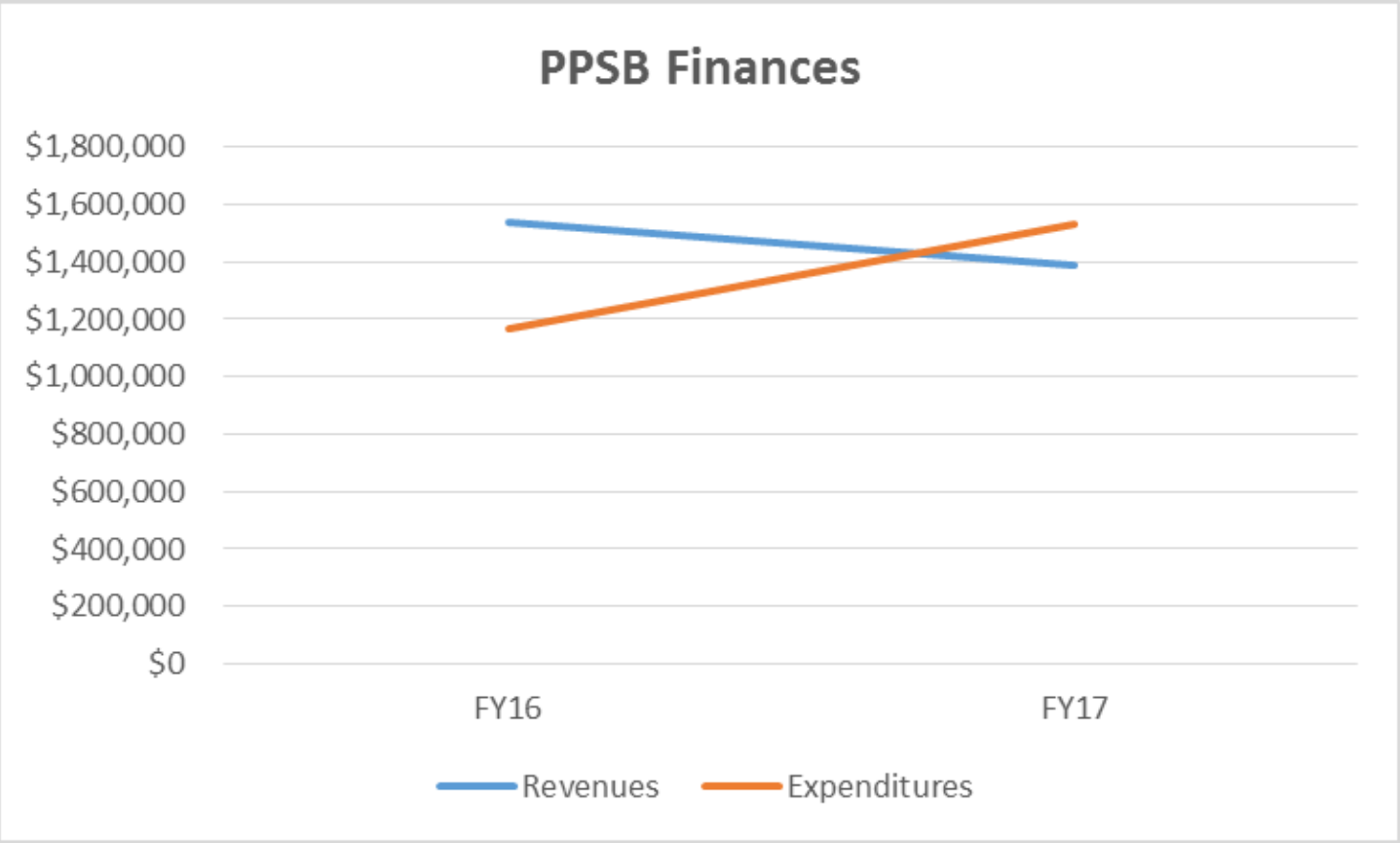

- Late fees

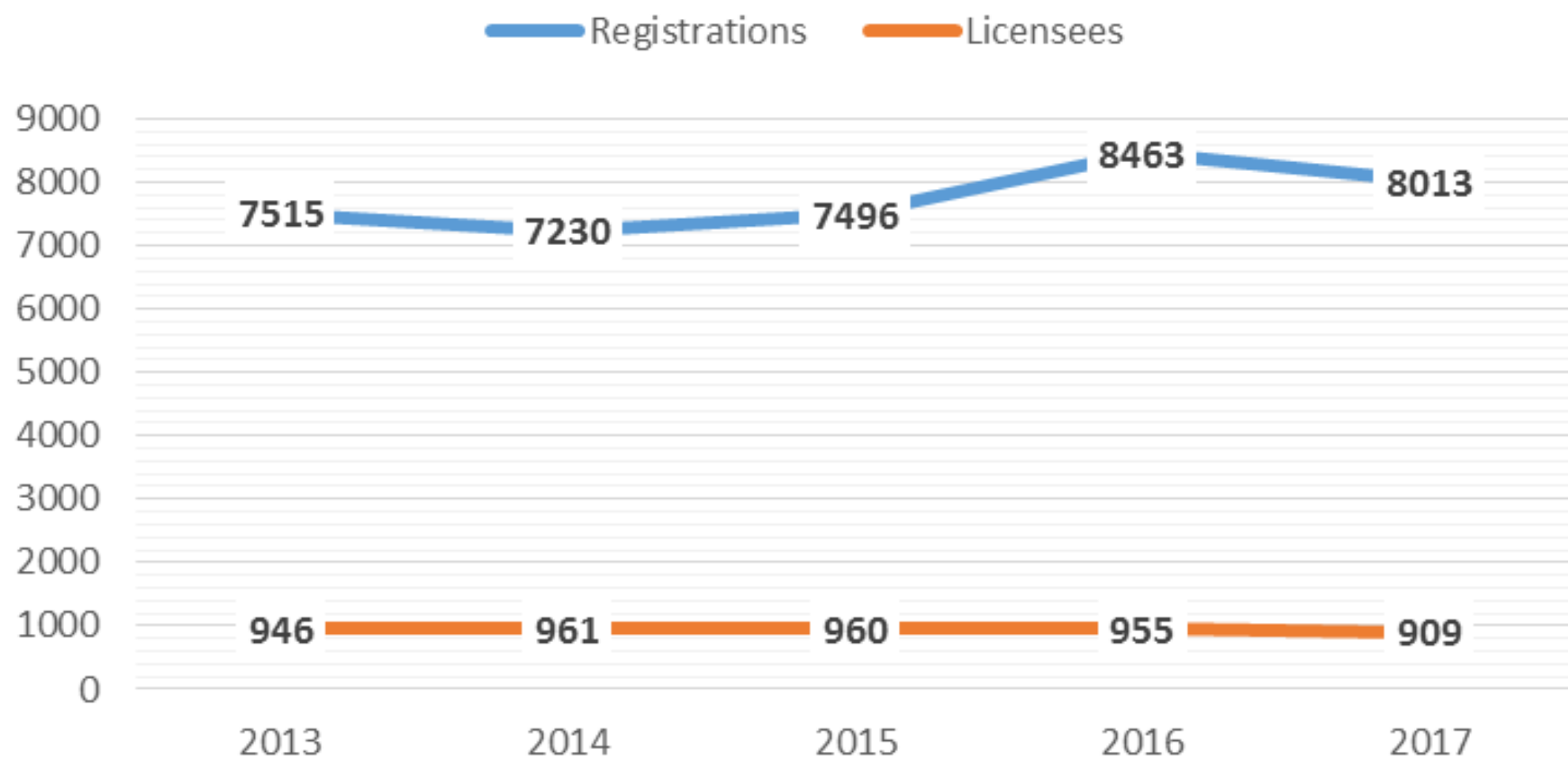

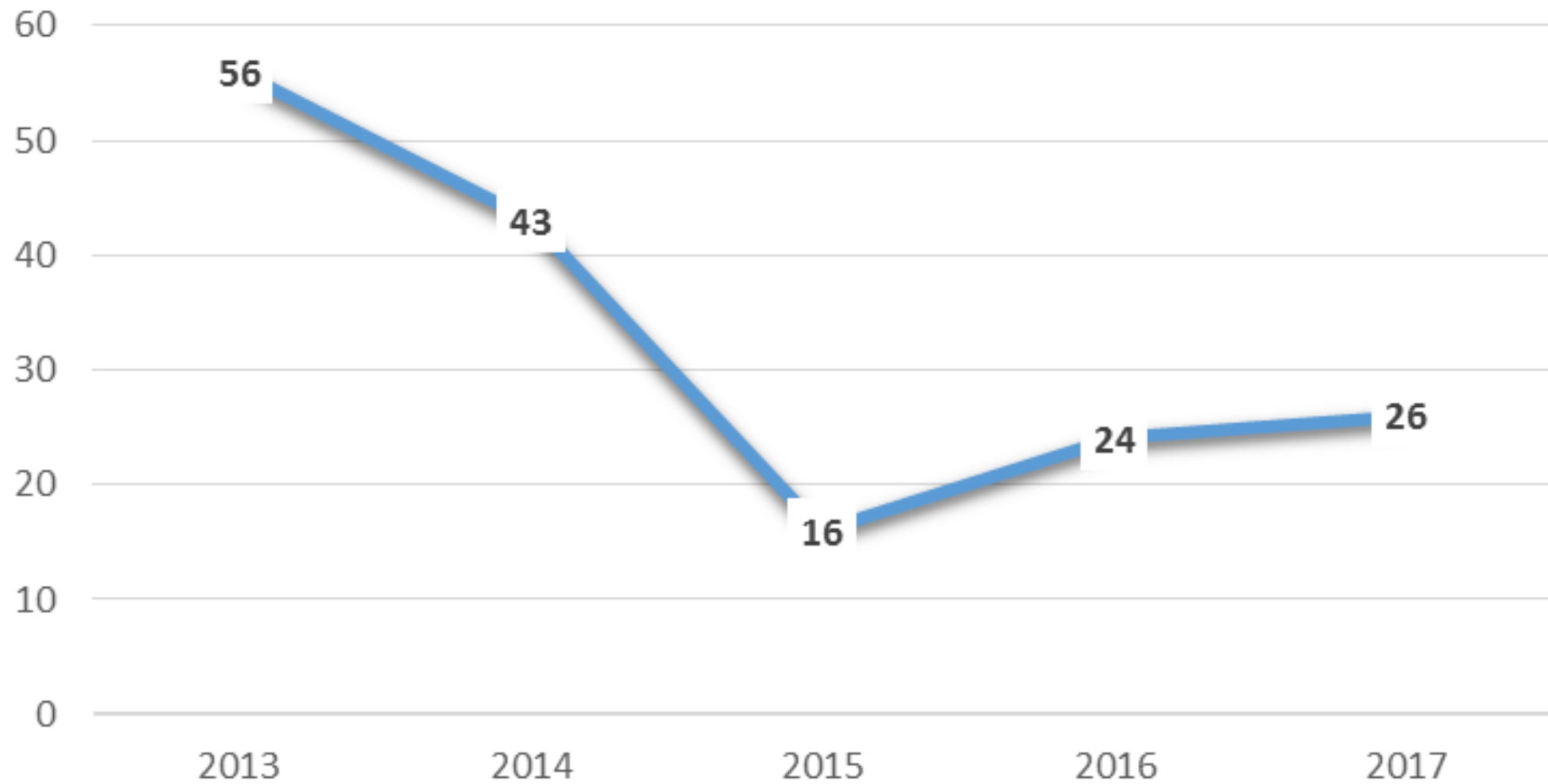
Alarm Systems Licensing Board (ASLB)

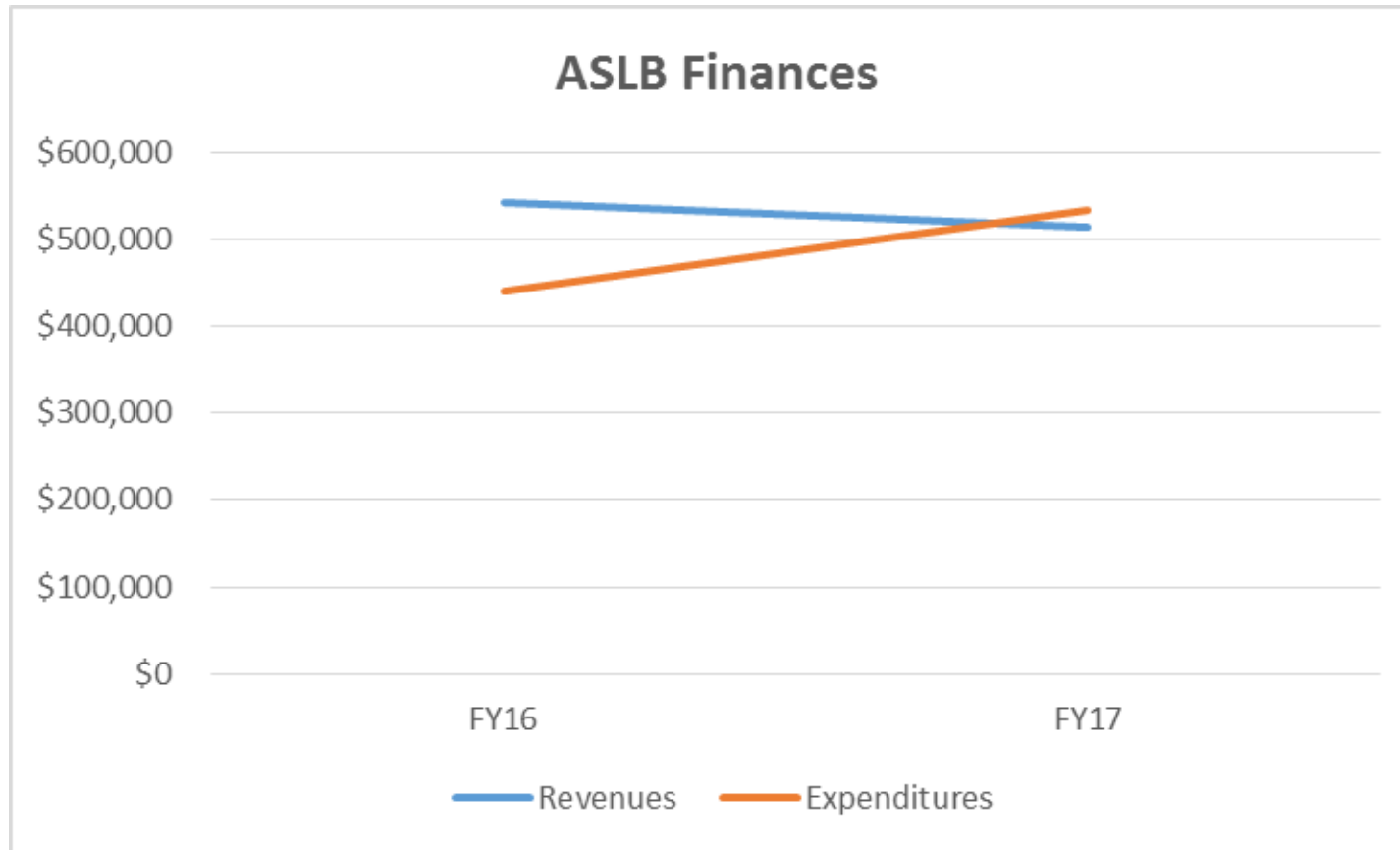
- Operates pursuant to the Alarm Systems Licensing Act (NCGS 74D)
- 7 Board members: the Secretary of Public Safety (or designee); 2 persons appointed by the Governor; 4 persons appointed by the General Assembly
- Administers licensing, registration, and training requirements for alarm systems profession
- Six two-day meetings annually
- Evaluates grievances against licensees
