





New complaints will enter slowly over time

8,673 new JJ Youth in 2020: Offense trend

NOTE: Complaints filed an average of 32 days following offense.

► JJ Received

- 62% of projected complaints
- 68% of projected juveniles

► JJ projected

- 254 juveniles to receive A-G complaints, and we received A-G complaints for 253 juveniles
- 158 RtA detention admissions, and we received 179 RtA detention admissions








RTA Projected Juveniles by Intake Decision (H to 3)






RTA Complaints By Districts




CY 2020 to date, delinquent complaints











Community Programs Projections- Statewide RtA for 2020

- ▶ Diversion juveniles to JCPC programs: 1,058
- ▶ Level I juveniles to JCPC programs: 1,310
- ▶ Level II juveniles to Level II programs: 604
- ▶ Potential at-risk youth: 9,283 (3.4% of total state 16 and 17 year old population)




- ▶ Expansion directive to JCPCs to address access to Teen Court /Restorative Justice models-

Community Programs RtA Expansion

- ▶ JCPC Tiered Planning Implemented
 - 1st year JCPC Expansion \$4.2M- allocated for current fiscal year (2019-20)
 - 2nd year JCPC Expansion \$6.6M- currently in RFP and award status with targeted completion by May 15th.
- ▶ New Transitional Living Home (Sturmer)- located in Forsyth County
 - 6- Bed capacity- Males
- ▶ Crisis and Assessment Center Expansion
 - 4-bed expansion at Bridges in Forsyth County
 - 2-bed expansion at Insight in Granville County
 - Eastern Area site location in being considered- Rocky Mount, NC



Positions Update

- ▶ **Court Services: 37 of the 97 JCC Positions were budgeted as of February 2020**
 - 40% hired of H1001
 - 95% hired from May positions
- ▶ **CA Dillon: 55% of certified and 43% of support staff hired**
- ▶ **Transportation: 10 of 15 positions hired (67%)**
- ▶ **Community Programs, Education, Administration (Training, Data, IT, HR): Interviewing, Posting, and pending position numbers**



Juvenile Justice RtA Initiatives

- ▶ Teleconferencing
- ▶ Telepsychiatry in Detention
- ▶ Edgecombe Pilot: Restorative Justice & Financial Literacy
 - Income, expenses, fines, budgeting, saving, delaying gratification.
- ▶ Re-entry: Risk to Resiliency
- ▶ Gang assessment began December 1, 2019



What are we seeing?

- ▶ Meeting projections
- ▶ Increased violent and serious offenses in pre-RtA and RtA populations
- ▶ Greater number of detention beds needed
 - \$13.4 million needed at current rate for full FY. Funded at \$4.5 million in FY20 and \$6.7 million in FY 21.
 - Continue to examine A-G felony rate
- ▶ Risk level 4 most common for RtA population, compared to RL3 for <16 year olds
- ▶ Early #s indicate greater % of closed and diverted RtA population than projected. Could be attributable to getting accustomed to new law.
