Pursuant to Section 16C.5 of Session Law 2013-360, the Department of Public Safety is required to report on county prisoners housed in the state prison system pursuant to safekeeping orders under G.S. 162-39 (b). Below are the details of that report.

- 1) The number of safekeepers housed by the Department on June 30, 2017: **224**
- 2) List of facilities where safekeepers are housed and the population of safekeepers by facility as of June 30, 2017:
