Report on Domestic Violence Homicides

DATE:

April 1, 2018

Pursuant to NC General Statute 143B-901, The Department of Public Safety, in consultation with the North Carolina Council for Women/Domestic Violence Commission, the North Carolina Sheriffs' Association, and the North Carolina Association of Chiefs of Police, shall develop a reporting system and database that reflects the number of homicides in the State where the offender and the victim had a personal relationship, as defined by G.S. 50B-1(b). The information in the database shall also include the type of personal relationship that existed between the offender and the victim, whether the victim had obtained an order pursuant to G.S. 50B-3, and whether there was a pending charge for which the offender was on pretrial release pursuant to G.S. 15A-534.1.

All State and local law enforcement agencies shall report information to the Department of Public Safety upon making a determination that a homicide meets the reporting system's criteria. The report shall be made in the format adopted by the Department of Public Safety. The Department of Public Safety shall report to the chairs of the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety, no later than April 1 of each year, with the data collected for the previous calendar year. # Report on Domestic Violence Related Homicides for Calendar Year 2017

## **Statistics**

There were 110 victims of domestic violence related homicide during calendar year 2017. This is the same number of events reported for calendar year 2016. The 2017 incidents catalogued 104 offenders, which is five fewer offenders than we reported in 2016. Additional information reported is as follows:

- ♦ 68 victims were female
- ♦ 42 victims were male
- ♦ 83 offenders were male
- ♦ 21 offenders were female
- Only one of the 110 victims (0.9%) had previously taken out protective orders when the homicide occurred. Of all the reports received for 2017 incidents, that incident where a protective order had been issued was the only case where the PO was current when the homicide occurred.
- ♦ One of the offenders was participating in a pre-trial release program, for a crime of domestic violence, when the homicide occurred.




## Relationship 6


