Re: HB379

Dear Honorable Chairpersons,

Session Law 2018-69 (HB 379) provides that "[a]ll State agencies ... that have the power to define conduct as a crime in the North Carolina Administrative Code shall create a list of all crimes defined by the agency ... that are in effect or pending implementation. Each agency ... shall submit the list to the Joint Legislative Administrative Procedure Oversight Committee and the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety no later than December 1, 2018."

The North Carolina State Bar is a state agency, but the State Bar is not empowered to define conduct as a crime, nor is there a crime defined in the State Bar's Administrative Code. The legislature has defined the unauthorized practice of law to be a crime, but that definition resides in Chapter 84 of the North Carolina General Statutes.
