NOTES:

- 1. Gaston County rarely criminally charges individuals with ordinance violations. To the best of my knowledge, the only criminal charges filed in the past five years arose from an animal control cruelty violation. Due to circumstances of the acts, it was more appropriate to charge under the ordinance as opposed to state law.
- 2. Some County Departments such as Cooperative Extension provide licenses pursuant to State and Federal laws/regulation. Violation of these could result in criminal penalties, but it is enforced by the State agency.
