General Obligation Parks and Recreation Bonds***


In accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. §120-157.2(a), the Town of Indian Trail, North Carolina (the "Town") hereby notifies you of its intent to place a referendum on the ballot on November 6, 2012 to seek voter approval for the issuance of general obligation bonds in the amount of \$8,500,000 to pay the costs of providing for the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement and equipping of parks and recreation facilities for a park located at 304 Matthews-Indian Trail Road and another community park to be designated by the Town, including the acquisition of land, rights-of-way and easements related thereto, if necessary.

If approved by the voters, the Town would expect to issue the general obligation bonds for the projects in one or more series beginning in 2013. The source of payment for the bonds will be the Town's general fund. The Town expects that the term of the bonds issued would not exceed 20 years. It is too soon to anticipate what interest rate would be on such bonds.

The Town has a debt policy that has been adopted by the Town Council. Please find a copy of this policy attached.

I have included with this notice the application that we have submitted to the North Carolina Local Government Commission for its approval. If you have any further questions please feel free to contact me.

RE: Financing of the Perquimans County Water Supply from Pasquotank County R.O. Plant Project

In accordance with Section 120-157.2(a) of the General Statutes of North Carolina, Perquimans County, North Carolina hereby notifies you of its intent to utilize an installment purchase contract under North Carolina General Statute 160A, Article 3, Section 20. The total principal amount is not to exceed 1.8 million. The project consists of the installation of 20,500 LF (approx. 4 miles) of 12" water line, 2 high service pumps and chemical feed equipment to deliver 150,000 gallons per day of treated drinking water from Pasquotank County R.O. Plant to the Perquimans County Water System. This project will improve the ability of the Perquimans County Water System to meet current and future water demands for Perquimans County residents. As required by the Local Government Commission, bids will be received on June 29, 2012.

Perquimans County anticipates that the North Carolina Local Government Commission will consider approval of the issuance of this proposed debt at its meeting scheduled for August 7, 2012.

To Whom It May Concern:

The Town of Taylorsville has applied for financing for the referenced project. As a continuation of the cooperative relationship between the Town of Taylorsville and EnergyUnited Water Corporation regarding their water systems, a number of improvements have been identified that would increase efficiency, redundancy, and reliability. The proposed project will address several needs, most of which relate to energy and other resource savings and to ensuring continuous potable water supply for Taylorsville. In brief, the project will consist of replacing a 1960's booster pump station, installing two tank mixing systems, purchasing 2,750 AMR meters, replacing two pump motors and starters, constructing approximately 12,900 linear feet of 8" waterlines, constructing one PRV vault, and making two new meter vault connections to supply the town.
