Re: Report of potential capital projects pursuant to Section 120-157.2 of the North Carolina General Statutes

Ladies and Gentlemen:

The City of Greensboro, North Carolina (the "City") hereby provides notice, pursuant to Section 120-157.2 of the North Carolina General Statutes of proposed capital projects consisting of (i) the completion of improvements to the Greensboro War Memorial Coliseum Complex (the "Coliseum Complex"), including interior renovations, façade improvements, site improvements, and expansion of parking facilities at the Coliseum Complex, and (ii) the completion of the City's aquatics center, which is now part of the Coliseum Complex (collectively, the "Project").

The Project cost is not to exceed \$2.5 million and is expected to be financed with up to \$2 million of the proceeds of limited obligation bonds of the City (the "Bonds"), and other moneys available to the City. The City expects to make debt service payments on the Bonds from the City's share of hotel/motel occupancy tax receipts, and if necessary, general non-

property tax revenue of the City. The City will grant a security interest in a portion real property comprising the Coliseum Complex to secure its obligations under the Bonds.

In compliance with General Statute 120-157.1 through 157.9, this letter serves as notice that Bessemer City will apply for an Installment Loan to be used for streets and sidewalks improvements. The loan amount and terms are expected to be \$1,200,000 for a 15-year term with an estimated 3.5% to 4.5% interest charge. The expected source of loan repayment will be general fund ad valorem taxes and the expected security of the loan will be the improved sidewalks and streets. Not to exceed \$60,000,000 City of Winston-Salem, North Carolina Limited Obligation Bond, Series 2014B and C

In accordance with N.C. Gen. Stat. §120-157.2(a) (the "Statute"), the City of Winston-Salem, North Carolina (the "City") hereby notifies you of its intent to execute and deliver an amendment (the "Contract Amendment") to an installment purchase contract (the "Original Contract," and together with the Contract Amendment, the "Contract") with the North Carolina Municipal Leasing Corporation (the "Corporation"), pursuant to which the Corporation will execute and deliver the above-referenced one or more series of limited obligation bonds (collectively, the "Bonds") in an amount not to exceed \$60,000,000. The City intends to apply the proceeds of the Bonds, in part, to finance (a) the acquisition of condominium interests in the Bryce A. Stuart Building not currently owned by the City, (b) certain additional improvements to the Benton Convention Center, (c) certain improvements to Union Station, and (d) Business 40 corridor improvements.

As security for the Bonds, the City will execute and deliver a notice of extension to an existing deed of trust to extend the lien of such deed of trust to additional property for the benefit of the Corporation. The obligation of the City to make the Installment Payments and Additional Payments (each as defined in the Contract) shall constitute a limited obligation of the City, payable solely from currently budgeted appropriations of the City and shall not constitute a general obligation or other indebtedness of the City within the meaning of the Constitution of the State of North Carolina (the "Constitution") or a direct or indirect pledge of the faith and credit or taxing power of the City within the meaning of the Constitution.

The City expects that the North Carolina Local Government Commission (the "Commission") will consider for approval the City's proposal to execute and deliver the Contract Amendment at the Commission's September meeting.
