#### City of Dunn, North Carolina Installment Financing

This is the second letter that includes the certified copy of the City Council's meeting last night where the public hearing was held including findings and where authorization was granted. The City attorney's opinion will follow the Contract with the selected Bank.

The city expects that the Contract will have a term of between 15 and 20 years and that the amount advanced to the City under the Contract will be approximately \$2,200,000 (not to exceed \$2,500,000). The City may pay its obligation under the contract from any source of funds available to it in each year. The City's obligation to make payments under the Contract is a limited obligation of the City, subject to annual appropriation, and will not constitute a direct or indirect pledge of the faith and credit or the taxing power of the City.



Motion unanimously approved.


#### Resolutions for Tart Park Loan

*Public Hearing* concerning the City of Dunn entering into a financing agreement obligating the City to make installment payments for a principal amount not to exceed \$2,200,000 plus interest in reference to the Clarence Lee Tart Park renovations and construction. The public hearing was duly advertised on April 28, 2020. Mayor Elmore opened the Public Hearing at 7:16 p.m.

Finance Director Roberts presented the request to the Council to approve the resolution to file the application that is needed with the LGC. He also presented the resolution to proceed with the loan process. No additional comments have been received by the City Clerk and with no further comments, the Public Hearing was closed.

Motion by Council Member Tart and second by Council Member Bradham to adopt the Resolutions authorizing the filing of an application of a Financing Agreement and to authorize the Mayor and City Manager to execute any and all documents to proceed with the loan. **Motion unanimously approved.** A copy of the Resolution (R2020-07) is incorporated into these minutes as Attachment #5 and Resolution (R2020-08) as Attachment #6.

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# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF A FINANCING AGREEMENT AUTHORIZED BY NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTE 160A-20

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dunn City Council, Dunn, North Carolina desires to renovate Clarence Lee Tart Park (the "Project") to better serve the citizens of Dunn; and

**WHEREAS**, The City of Dunn desires to finance the Project by the use of an installment contract authorized under North Carolina General Statute 160A, Article 3, Section 20; and

**WHEREAS**, findings of fact by this governing body must be presented to enable the North Carolina Local Government Commission to make its findings of fact set forth in North Carolina General Statute 159, Article 8, Section 151 prior to approval of the proposed contract;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of Dunn, North Carolina, meeting in regular session on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2020, make the following findings of fact:

- 1. The proposed contract is necessary to renovate Clarence Lee Tart Park.
- 2. The proposed contract is preferable to a bond issue for the same purpose because the method of financing proposed best allows the City to expedite construction of the facility, and will allow the City to pay for the facility of a shorter period of time. Further the relative small amount to be financed would not justify the cost of a bond issue.
- 3. The sums to fall due under the contract are adequate and not excessive for the proposed purpose because the construction contract will be awarded to the lowest bidder who will perform the contract in a qualified manner, and the financing contract will be awarded to the financial institution that submits the most favorable proposal.
- 4. The City of Dunn's debt management procedures and policies are good because it fully complies with all statutory requirements involving debt management.
- 5. The increase in taxes necessary to meet the sums to fall due under the proposed contract will be 2 cents per \$100 valuation and is not deemed to be excessive.
- 6. The City of Dunn is not in default in any of its debt service obligations.
- 7. The attorney for the City of Dunn will render an opinion that the proposed Project is authorized by law and is a purpose for which public funds may be expended pursuant to the Constitution and laws of North Carolina.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City Manager is hereby authorized to act on behalf of the City of Dunn in filing an application with the North Carolina Local Government Commission for approval of the Project and the proposed financing contract and other actions not inconsistent with this resolution.

This resolution is effective upon its adoption this  $12^{th}$  day of May, 2020.

The motion to adopt this resolution was made by <u>Council Member Tart</u>, seconded by <u>Council Member Bradham</u> and passed by a vote of <u>b</u> to <u>o</u>.





City of Dunn Notice of Public Hearing Installment Financing Agreement for Renovation of Tart Park

The City Council of the City of Dunn will hold a public hearing on May 12, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in the courtroom of the Dunn Municipal Building, 401 E. Broad Street, Dunn, NC. It is the desire of the Dunn City Council to enter into an installment financing agreement (the "Agreement") pursuant to Section 160A-20 of the General Statutes of North Carolina obligating the City to make installment payments thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$2,200,000 plus interest thereon. The Agreement is for the purpose of providing funds, together with any other available funds to pay the cost of Clarence Lee Tart Park renovations and construction (the "Project"). Section 160A-20(g) of the General Statutes of North Carolina requires that the City hold a public hearing prior to entering into the Agreement. If the City Council so determines, an application will be submitted to the Local Government Commission of North Carolina for approval of the Agreement.

All persons desiring to be heard either for or against the proposed item set forth above are requested to follow the following procedures due to COVID-19:
