North Carolina Identity Management (NCID)

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Overview



What is Identity Management?

Identity management is the management of individual identities -- their authentication, authorization and privileges within or across system and enterprise boundaries. Goal is increasing security and productivity while decreasing cost, downtime and repetitive tasks.

What is NCID?

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Benefits of NCID and Identity Management

| Simplified administration with standardized account and password management |
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| Provides a single view of the user – one ID for many applications (For example Email, BEACON) |
| Improves security through better policy and authorization enforcement by granting access to specific applications and data |
| Delivers economies of scale across infrastructure, software and administrative costs thus reducing statewide total cost of ownership |

NCID Program Costs (FY 2011/12)



- 2011/2012 Program Costs: \$5.99 M
 - Software Costs and Services \$ 3,433,850
 - Product and Maintenance Costs (Novell Software Suite) \$ 1,350,000
 - Infrastructure costs (Server and Hosting) \$ 1,766,350
 - Dedicated Network Equipment \$ 100,000
 - Professional Services (Specialized vendor services) \$ 100,000
 - Security and Encryption \$ 117,500
 - Support and Administrative Services- \$ 1,734,692
 - NCID Integration Work with agencies integrating applications and testing
 - Technical Support Implement patches, upgrades, directory services and ensure infrastructure availability
 - Enterprise Identity Management Analysts Develop & support customizations to NCID components for Identity Management, workflow & web service access.
 - Agency Overhead \$ 829,167
- ☐ Coverage: 250,000 identities (projected by June 2012)
 160 applications across 26 agencies

Cost per identity \$ 24.00 per ID / year Industry standard: \$ 21.00 per ID / year



<u>Goal</u>: Drive usage and reduce operating costs to below industry standard



NCID Program Next Steps



- ☐ Focus on reducing program (and unit) costs
- Continued expansion/integration with key statewide systems

 NCFAST (NC Families Accessing Services through Technology for family support program);
 - DOA eProcurement (NCEP)
 - DENR Authentication Integration into application framework

 - DOT Trip Permits Application
 - DPI Licensure Automation System for Teacher Accreditation



Result: Anticipated growth of ~ 400,000-500,000 new identities (phased in FY 12-13)

- Increased growth/usage with minimal incremental infrastructure cost
- Cost per identity expected to decrease by at least 50%

 - Single Sign On across multiple systems
 - Simplified integration, administration, and reporting
