Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRFT)

- Service available to recipients under the age of 21
- Non- acute impatient facility care for Mental Health and/or Substance Abuse
- Each PRTF unit serves no more than 12 children or adolescents
- Highly structured 24-hour therapeutic setting (life skills, problem solving & medication mgmt)
- History of multiple hospitalizations with poor adherence to other interventions
- Educational services are provided through a facility based school

Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRFT)

Program is directed by a board-eligible or certified child psychiatrist or general psychiatrist with experience in treating children

- Must be nationally accredited
- Must be licensed by Division of Health Service Regulation

• May be subject to institutional building codes • Highly medically monitored and supervised Facilities require 2 staff for every 6 recipients Authorization for 14 days with option for up to 30 days (not intended for long stays)

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Current Status of PRFT's

- Proposed amendment to current rule presented in August to the MHDDSAS Commission
- Proposed amendment to the current rule would allow PRTF's to serve up to 18 children or adolescents per unit
- Allows for expanded component of the treatment continuum
- Service has expanded from 298 Beds (2008) to 405 Beds (2009)
- **Commission approved proposed amendment-currently pending for fiscal note and then public comment period
