Handler's Act

- Article 44 of G.S. 106-496 was created in 1941 and was last updated in 1994.
- The act pertains only to handlers of fresh fruits and vegetables.
- Anyone who deals with the purchase or transportation of fresh produce is considered a handler.
- The purpose is to protect NC farmers against unfair trade practices.



Handler's Act-Permit

- The article covers only <u>written contracts</u> with no association to spot market sales.
- Handlers must request a permit from NCDA&CS.
- Permit applications are required by <u>March 1</u> every year before any written contracts are made.


Handlers must provide:

- 1) Two copies of a blank contract along with related requirements that would apply to the grower.
- 2) A notarized letter of bonding.



Permits

- 19 companies have a 2017 Handler's Act permit.
- 25,100 acres are grown under contract for companies who have a Handler's Permit.

Handler's Act-Permit

- The penalty for not applying for a permit is \$25.00.
- Any person who violates the provisions of this Article or the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- A bond is required made payable to the Commissioner of Agriculture in the amount of not less than \$10,000.00 or more than \$50,000.00.
