Mail Verification

 SBOE Mail Verification Process is guided by State Law and the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA)

(d) Undelivered notices

If a notice of the disposition of a mail voter registration application . . . is sent by nonforwardable mail and is returned undelivered, the registrar may proceed in accordance with section 1973gg-6(d) of this title.



NVRA

Verification of Address by Mail. - If the county board of elections tentatively determines that the applicant is qualified to vote at the address given, then the county board shall send a notice to the applicant, by nonforwardable mail, at the address the applicant provides on the application form. The notice shall state that the county will register the applicant to vote if the Postal Service does not return the notice as undeliverable to the county board. The notice shall also inform the applicant of the precinct and voting place to which the applicant will be assigned if registered.



GS 163-82.7(c)

1st Verification Mailing (d) Approval of Application. - If the Postal Service does not return the notice as undeliverable, the county board shall register the applicant to vote.



GS 163-82.7(d)

Second Notice if First Notice Is Returned as Undeliverable. - If the Postal Service returns the notice as undeliverable, the county board shall send á second notice by nonforwardable mail to the same address to which the first was sent. If the second notice is not returned as undeliverable, the county board shall register the applicant to vote...

2nd Verification Mailing

Denial of **Application Based** on Lack of Verification of Address. - If the Postal Service returns as undeliverable the notice sent by nonforwardable mail pursuant to subsection (e) of this section, the county board shall deny the application. The county board need not try to notify the applicant further.



DENIAL OF REGISTRATION




Mail Verification - New Registration Process





(d) Undelivered notices

If a notice of the disposition of a mail voter registration application . . . is sent by nonforwardable mail and is returned undelivered, the registrar may proceed in accordance with section 1973gg-6(d) of this title.



NVRA

- (1) A State shall **not remove** the name of a registrant from the official list of eligible voters in elections for Federal office on the ground that the registrant has changed residence unless the registrant—
- (A) **confirms in writing** that the registrant has changed residence to a place outside the registrar's jurisdiction in which the registrant is registered; or
- (B)(i) has failed to respond to a notice described in paragraph (2); and (ii) has not voted or appeared to vote (and, if necessary, correct the registrar's record of the registrant's address) in an election during the period beginning on the date of the notice and ending on the day after the date of the second general election for Federal



§ 1973gg-6(d)

NVRA

Removal of names from voting rolls

The name of a registrant may not be removed from the official list of eligible voters except—

(A) at the request of the registrant;

(B) as provided by State law, by reason of criminal conviction or mental incapacity; or (C) as provided under paragraph (4);



§ 1973gg-6(a)(3)

NVRA

Removal Methods The State must "conduct a general program that makes a reasonable effort to remove the names of ineligible voters from the official lists of eligible voters by reason of—

- (A) the death of the registrant; or
- (B) a change in the residence of the registrant . . . "



NVRA

Uniform Program



Reasons for Removal Under NVRA

- Voter requests to be removed
- Voter is deceased
- Voter loses citizenship rights due to felony conviction
- Voter moves



Mail Verification & List Maintenance Challenges



Mail Verification & List Maintenance Fallacy

Verification of Address by Mail verifies that a person lives where they say that they live.



Mail Verification & List Maintenance Fact

Verification of Address by Mail only verifies that a mailing can be sent to the registrant and is not returned as undeliverable – It does not verify that the person lives where they say that they live.




Mail Verification Flaws


Purpose of verification is to verify that the voter is eligible at the <u>address</u> they provide on voter registration form.

- Dependent on the mail being returned undeliverable
- Not always verifying residence
- Postal issues
- If someone votes before mail verification is complete, the voter cannot be **DENIED**.





Recent Improvements to List Maintenance Procedures

2014 Interstate Crosscheck

- 28 States Participated
- 101 Million records



Results:

- 765 voters exact match of first and last name, DOB and last four of SSN---registered in NC and another state and voted in NC and the other state in 2012 general election.
- 35,750 voters with first and last name and DOB match that are registered in NC and another state and voted in both in 2012 general election.
- 155,692 voters exact match of first and last name, DOB and last four of SSN---registered in NC and another state and NC is not the latest date of registration or activity.

These results are being investigated by our office.



10-year Death Audit

- Identified 50,000+ new death records from DHHS that had not previously been provided to SBOE.
- Audit identified 13,416 deceased voters on voter rolls in October 2013. These votes were subsequently removed.
- Data: 81 deceased voters have voter history later than the date of their death.

Implementing the use of Electronic and Digital Information at the Polling Place



Legislative Request

- Obtaining digital photographs of registered voters and verifying identity of those voters.
- Maintaining information stored electronically in a secure fashion.
- Utilizing electronically stored information, including digital photographs and electronic signatures, to create electronic poll books.
- Using electronic poll books to assist in identifying individuals attempting to vote more than once in an election.
- A proposed plan for a pilot project to implement electronic poll books, including the taking of digital photographs at the polling place to supplement the electronic poll books.
- Any other related matter identified by the State Board impacting the use of digital and electronic information in the voting place.




Current Capabilities

The State Board of Elections currently has an Electronic Poll Book for use in all Elections. With our current software we can do the following:

- Maintain information stored electronically in a secure fashion. Current information is encrypted before it leaves the server to and from the electronic poll book.
- Utilize electronically stored information, including digital photographs and electronic signatures, to create electronic poll books. We currently have electronic information in our current poll book; adding photographs and signatures would merely be an enhancement.
- Assist in identifying individuals attempting to vote more than once in an election. (Currently data is audited for double voting after the election.)



Data Needed

The State Board of Elections has the ability to upgrade our software to include photographs of voters obtained by DMV and supplement them with photographs taken at the polling site.

To accomplish: (1) Obtaining digital photographs of registered voters and verifying identity of those voters.

We are currently working with DMV to obtain Driver License Photographs and signatures. Even though we have two completely different IT systems (mainframe vs. Microsoft) there should be no issues. We currently receive data and images from DMV on a daily basis.



New Functionality

To accomplish: A proposed plan for a pilot project to implement electronic poll books, including the taking of digital photographs at the polling place to supplement the electronic pollbooks.

We would need to add an enhancement to our current electronic pollbook system to add the ability to take a picture at the polling place to either supplement missing images or capture all images.

To have 100% of the voter images, we can collect any photographs that we could not match with DMV records at the time a voter presents to vote.







Project Plan to Pilot

 Obtain DMV photographs and signatures and enhance Statewide Voter Registration System to store and link to registered voters. Current Status: Working with DMV on method and timeframe to transfer images with current data updates.

• Enhance current electronic poll book to include linked photographs and signatures. Current Status: In the planning phase, looking to pilot during 2015 municipal election cycle.

 Costs would be minimal to the state since we would utilize internal resources to complete and our current software is already designed to handle images. County costs would include laptops, printers, and web cameras for those not using our electronic poll book.

E-Poll Book Considerations

Connectivity

•There are currently over 2,700 polling locations in North Carolina. Obtaining internet connection for a day at every site would not only be expensive, but difficult in many locations.

County Investment Not all counties are using electronic poll books. Counties would need to procure printers, laptops, and web cameras to use our software.


Efficiencies & Integrity

 All counties using electronic poll books would allow for faster data entry of voter history, thus allowing for duplicate checking prior to canvass. The following is a summary of the poll book method utilized by North Carolina counties in the 2012 General Election:

The Future?



Challenges:

 List maintenance for duplicate voter registrations and voting is challenging since matching on names and birth dates are not always exact.

Solution:

 Utilize facial recognition or biometrics to check for multiple voter registrations and voting.



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2014 PRIMARY VOTER GUIDE

SUMMARY OF RECENT ELECTION LAW CHANGES

No Same Day REGISTRATION

Persons who are not registered to vote in a county can no longer register to vote in person during the onestop early voting period. Same day registration is no longer an option. Qualified persons who wish to vote in an election must register to vote no later than 25 days before the date of the election.

ONE-STOP VOTING

One-stop early voting will now begin on the second Thursday prior to the date of an election instead of the third Thursday prior to the date of the election. Unless a county board of elections requested an exception, the number of total cumulative hours for one-stop voting in the 2014 Primary or General Election will be comparable to the total cumulative hours for one-stop voting offered during the 2010 Primary or General Election, respectively.

No Out of Precinct Voting

Voters who vote on Primary Day must vote at the polling place for their correct precinct based on their residential address as of 30 days prior to the date of the election. County boards of elections will not be able to count any provisional ballot for a voter who does not vote at his or her correctly assigned polling place on Election Day.

PROVISIONAL VOTING

Whenever a voter is offered a provisional ballot, the election official issuing the ballot will now mark in writing or other means on the ballot that it is a provisional ballot. If a provisional ballot is incorrectly placed into the voting equipment at the voting site, any ballot that is marked as a provisional ballot will be retrieved. Any provisional ballot that is cast outside of a voter's correctly assigned precinct on Election Day will not be counted.

Рното ID

Voters will not be required to show a photo ID in order to vote during the 2014 Primary and General Election. When presenting to vote, a voter simply needs to state his or her current name and current address. As long as his or her name is on the list of registered voters in the precinct, he or she will be given a regular ballot and permitted to vote. Voters who present to vote in person (during one-stop early voting or on Election Day) this year will be given instructions that starting in 2016, voters will be required to show a photo ID when voting in person. Voters will be provided with a list of the types of photo ID that are acceptable for purposes of voting in this State. Voters will be asked whether they have one or more of these types of ID. If a voter indicates that he or she does not have a photo ID that will be acceptable for purposes of voting, the voter will be asked to sign an Acknowledgment of No Photo ID. These voters will be given instructions on how to obtain a no-fee photo ID from the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTION

Will I need to show photo ID when I vote in the primary this year?

Photo ID will not be required until 2016.
