## NC Medicaid SFY 2019-20: Actuals vs. Budget

For SFY 2019-20, appropriations expenditure for Medicaid & Health Choice was \$116 million or 3% less than budgeted.

## SFY 2020-21 Expenditure Forecast

Major drivers of projected SFY 2020-21 increased expenditure include the following:

- COVID-19 Treatment, Testing, & Policy/Rates \$600m
- Families First Act Non-terminations
  \$400m
- Families First Act FMAP Bonus (\$500m)
