

BETTER: PUBLIC SECTOR COSTS



Balancing costs (taxes) and benefits (public services)

ISSUE 1: STATE + LOCAL TAXES TOGETHER?



Yes, because states divide state and local functions differently – if not, an "apples and oranges" comparison

ISSUE 2: INCLUDE PUBLIC FEES?



Charges for direct benefits to an individual

Taxes: Used for "general" benefits

ISSUE 3: PEOPLE OR DOLLARS?




Taxes per capita







NC IS A LEADER IN "CORE" SPENDING




Public spending on education, roads, and public safety as a % of own revenues, '04
