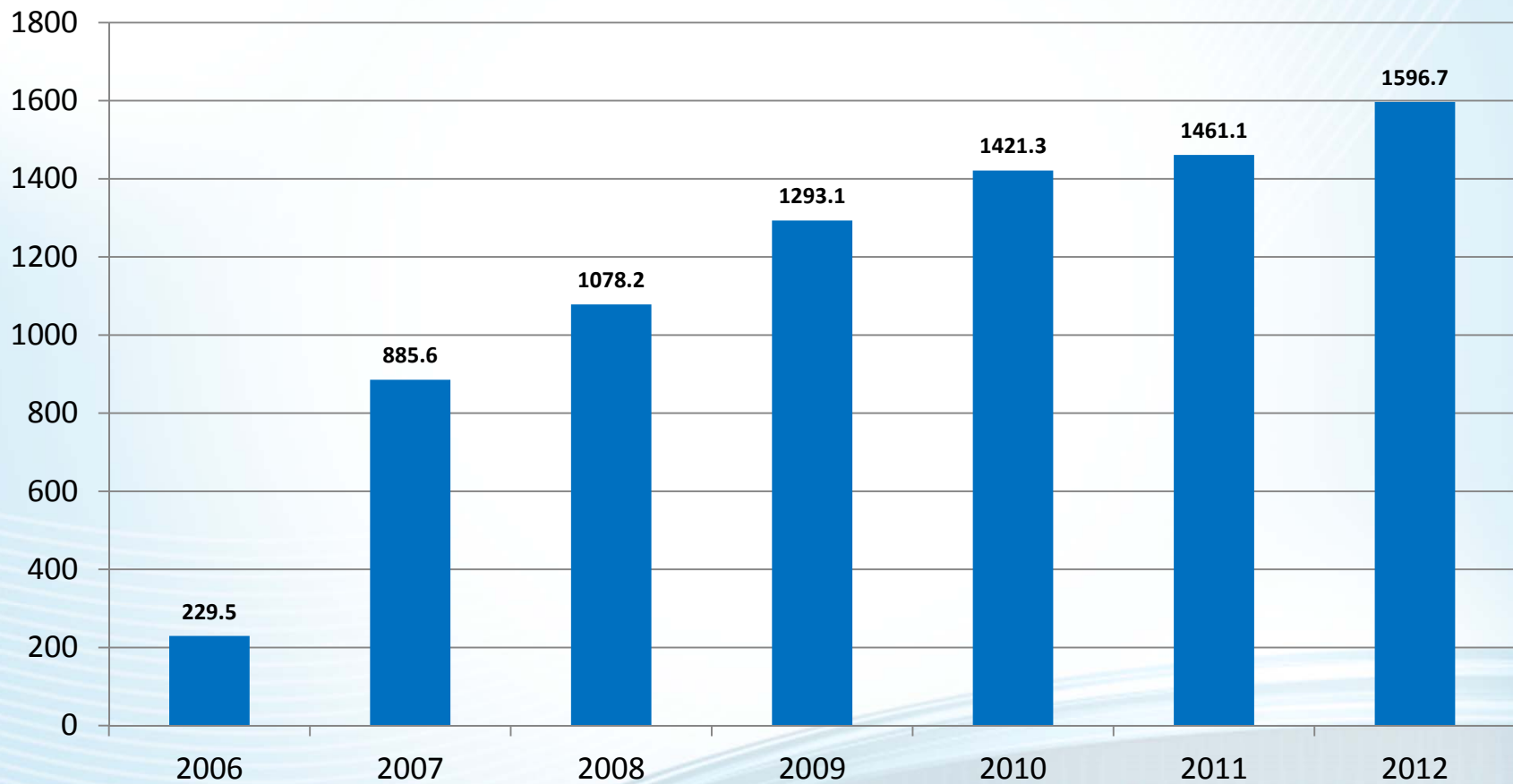

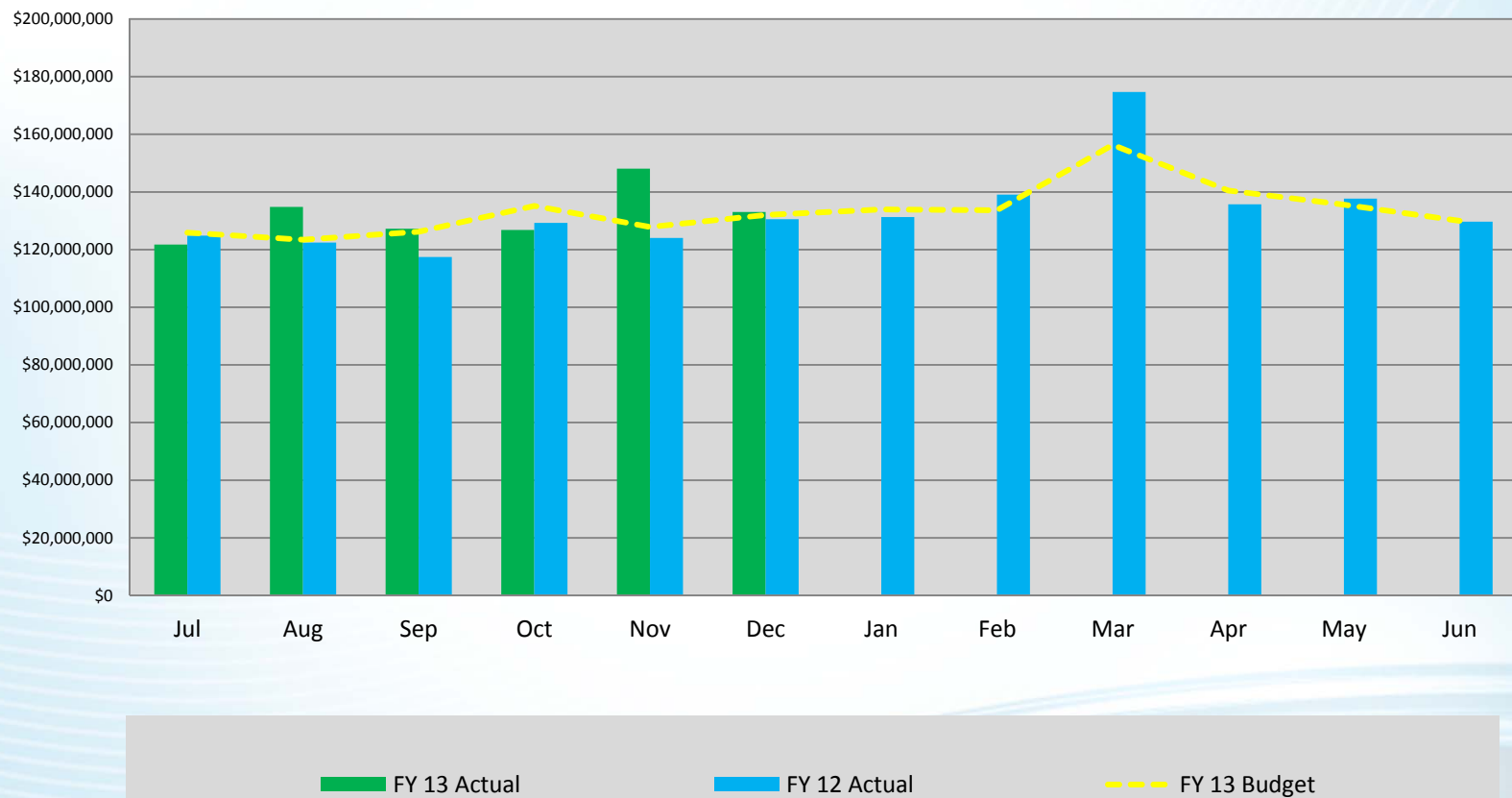
SALES HISTORY

Monthly Sales - All Products

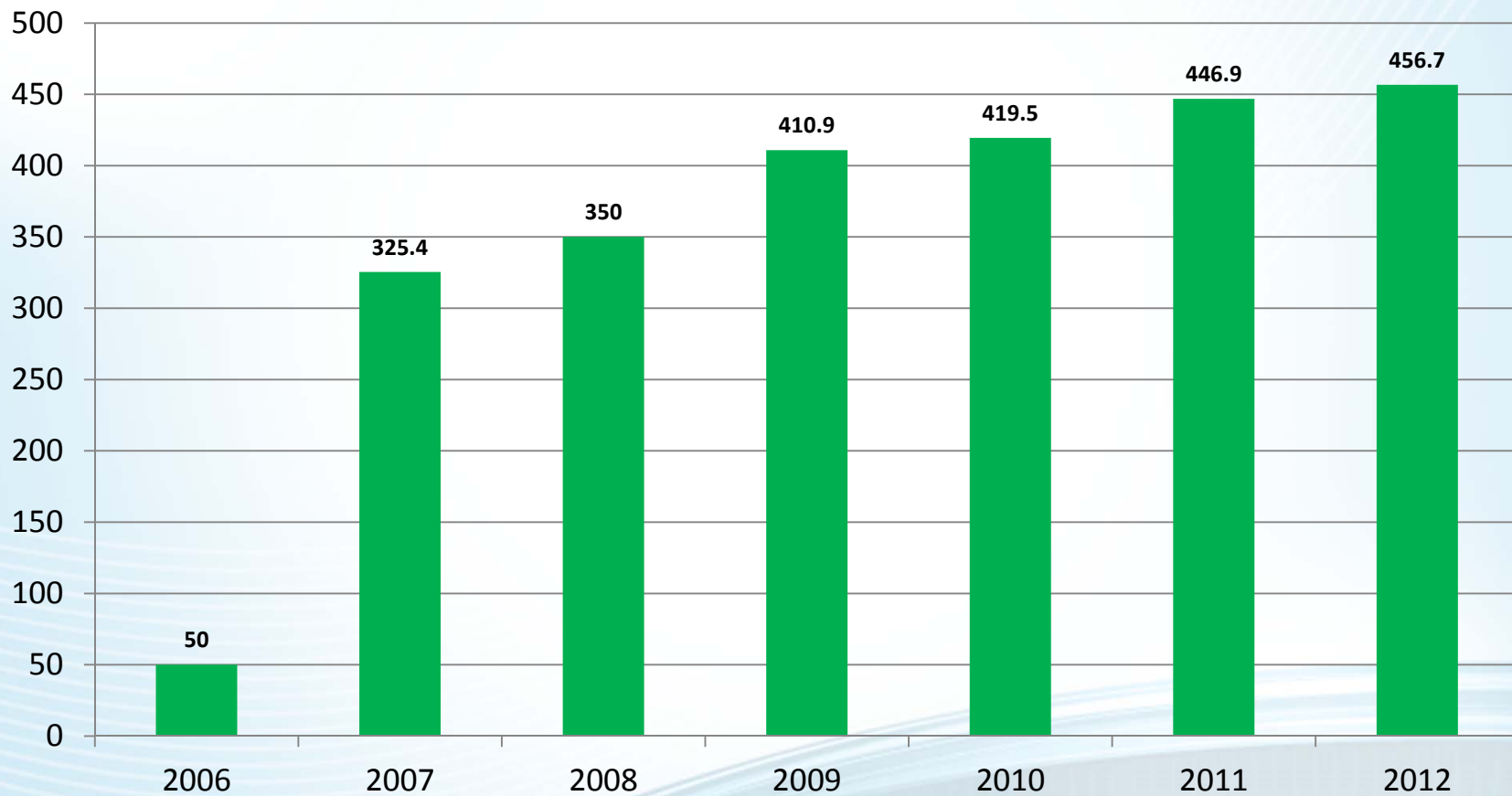


INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

- Education Lottery received a clean review, or “unqualified opinion,” in its annual financial audit completed in November.
- Audit done by independent auditors hired by North Carolina’s State Auditor.
- Finding is the highest standard that an organization can achieve.
- Sixth year in a row that lottery has received that rating in its annual financial audit.

- Transferred \$121.1 million to state on Oct. 25, 2012
- Up 5 percent from first transfer of FY12
- Brought total for education to \$2.58 billion
