RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO THE JORDAN LAKE RULES PUBLISHED ON JUNE 15, 2007 BY THE NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES

A motion was made by TAC Member Keith Holliday and seconded by TAC Member Kirk Perkins for the adoption of the following resolution, which upon being put to a vote was duly adopted.

WHEREAS, the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources on June 15, 2007 published rules which, if adopted, will be the strictest watershed rules to date in the state and will enforce nutrient limits and implement a nutrient management strategy for the Jordan Lake watershed; AND

WHEREAS, the Haw River arm of the Jordan Lake watershed includes part of the planning area for the Greensboro Urban Area MPO; AND

WHEREAS, the proposed rules fail to satisfactorily address numerous policy, scientific and economic problems, as well as substantial problems relating to data credibility; AND

WHEREAS, the rules do not contain clear estimates of the cost of compliance for transportation agencies such as the North Carolina Department of Transportation; AND

WHEREAS, the cost burdens of the proposed Rules on local governments may adversely affect regional transportation funding priorities and thus reduce the region's competitiveness;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Greensboro Urban Area Transportation Advisory Committee hereby opposes the Jordan Lake Rules, published June 15, 2007, on this, the 25th day of July, 2007.
