




Barriers for North Carolina Farmers Markets

Recommendations

- → Exempt farmers market managers from the requirements of NCGS 66-255
- → Examine NC regulations on processed foods and prepared foods at markets and make them more supportive of entrepreneurs producing safe products
- → Support efforts to provide training and technical assistance to farmers and farmers market managers on how to make markets more welcoming to all customers and how to efficiently and sustainably manage SNAP at market program
- → Support NC markets and community organizations efforts to access Farm Bill funds for matching programs
- → Provide funds for community-based organizations and agencies for training and technical assistance and outreach
