### Transylvania County

- A rural, western county
- Over half our county is state or national forest land
- Economy improving but still suffering
- Population aging
- Student enrollment 3,412 ADM in FY18, stable to declining
- Local funding good support from county



#### Current System Likes/Dislikes

- LIKES
  - Position funding
  - Base funding
  - Flexibility instructional supplies, remediation, certain classes of personnel
- DISLIKES (Areas for Improvement)
  - Low wealth/small school allotments
  - Charter school growth funding
  - Lack of flexibility digital learning
  - Capped allotments (Children with Disabilities, Limited English Proficiency)

# Children With Disabilities (PRC 032)

- SCHOOL AGE Based on child count with an overall 12.75% CAP of the Allotted ADM by the dollar per child count funding factor.
- PRESCHOOL Base amount equal to the average salary and benefits of a classroom teacher, plus additional funding based on preschool headcount.
- Additional funding for group and foster homes, and similar facilities.



# Children With Disabilities (PRC 032)

- The funding cap limits the resources available to serve special needs students.
  - FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION Consider adopting recommendations of the Program Evaluation Division to remove or modify the funding cap.
- The funding formula does not differentiate between types of disabilities and required services.
  - FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION Consider adopting recommendations of the Program Evaluation Division to differentiate funding based on student disability.



# Children With Disabilities (PRC 032)

#### Recommendation 3 of Report Number 2016-11

 Children with Disabilities. Direct DPI to establish a framework that differentiates funding based on service setting and consider eliminating or restructuring the funding cap.





# Limited English Proficiency (PRC 054)

- Each eligible LEA/charter school receives the minimum of 1 teacher assistant position.
- 50% of remaining funds are distributed based on the concentration of LEP students within the LEA.
- 50% of remaining funds are distributed based on the weighted 3-year average headcount.
- MUST SERVE AT LEAST 20 STUDENTS
- FUNDING CAPPED AT 10.6%



### Limited English Proficiency (PRC 054)


- The funding threshold and cap limits the resources available to serve LEP students.
  - FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION Consider adopting recommendations of the Program Evaluation Division to remove or modify the funding threshold and cap.
- The funding formula does not fully factor in the number of languages primarily spoken.
  - FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION Consider simplifying the formula by replacing the concentration factor with a new factor based on the number of languages primarily spoken by a district's English language learners.

### Limited English Proficiency (PRC 054)

#### Recommendation 3 of Report Number 2016-11

 Limited English Proficiency (LEP). Eliminate the minimum funding threshold and cap, and provide a graduated per-headcount amount for LEP students that observes economies of scale.







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
