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## Onslow County Schools

- 12<sup>th</sup> largest school district
- 26,000+ students with average growth of over 300 per year
- Schools 20 elementary, 8 middle, 8 high
- Approximately 40% of students are federally connected

  - Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune
  - Marine Corps Air Station New River



# Existing Funding System - Likes

- Position Allotments
  - Allow every district to hire most qualified candidate available
    - Teachers, Instructional Support Personnel, Assistant Principals, Principals
  - Provide funding to cover State mandated salaries and benefits
  - Ensure stability in planning staffing levels
- Flexibility
  - Maximizes resources for best student outcomes



# Existing Funding System - Likes

- Current resource allocation approach
  - Attempts to address adequacy in funding of common educational needs through a series of funding formulas to reflect costs of services
  - Utilizes a variety of formulas
    - Base allotments
    - Student-based populations
    - District characteristics
    - Programs



## Existing Funding System - Dislikes

- Allotment cap & lack of differentiation for Children with Special Needs
  - Results in lack of State funding necessary to provide optimal level of service
- Calculation changes by BEA of per capita income data for Low Wealth
  - Negatively effects heavily impacted military communities
- Funding formulas are no longer included as continuation budget items
  - Eliminates automatic adjustments for ADM growth
  - Reduces certainty in planning process
- Reduction in flexibility
  - Restricts opportunity to address district/school specific student needs



#### Existing Funding System - Recommendations

- Modify current funding formulas to address highlighted issues in need of improvement
- Utilize professional judgement from educators and administrators in developing goals for sufficient resources
  - Enable every school district to provide each student with opportunities for successful career and college readiness
- Update existing resource allocation formulas to address emerging needs and adequacy of funding on a regular ongoing basis
  - Engage experts to estimate costs of adequate funding
- Continue to allow Superintendents and Finance Officers to serve as a resource in your endeavor to best meet the needs of the State's students





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
