

COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL Direction and Purpose Statements

DIRECTION: Community High School will provide at-risk youth in Buncombe County Schools with the opportunity to receive an education in a traditional but modified school environment.

PURPOSE: Our purpose is to meet the individual needs of our students through a relevant curriculum and guidance, and to provide meaningful opportunities for success in school and in the community.

- At-Risk Factors: gaps, tardiness or poor attendance, unmanageable behavior, grade retention, substance abuse, alienation from school life, unaddressed/inadequately addressed learning needs, inadequate/lack of parental and family support, trauma, juvenile justice involvement, previous drop out
- ▶ Gaps may include learning, social, emotional, mental health, socio-economic
- Small student body: 170 students
- ▶ Small Classes </= 15</p>
- ▶ Reduced School Day: 3 Block Schedule
- Instructional Services: Counseling, Social Worker, Graduation Initiative Specialist, Career Development Coordinator, Twilight School and Summer Minimester, Credit Recovery Options, EC, ESL, Media Center
- Eagle Time: Weekly Remediation, Clubs of Interest, Advisory
- ▶ Transportation from each of 6 Traditional High Schools and Asheville High School
- Continuum of Services




