Caleb Snow, Surry Central High School junior, is a Next Generation Career Academy Intern at Smith-Rowe, LLC. He completed his construction courses at high school and is now gaining hands-on experience at his paid internship. Next year, Caleb plans to enroll in the Construction Management program as a dual-enrolled student at Surry Community College.



- 12 student interns have been placed in workbased learning opportunities - Spring 2018.
- One student has been offered full-time employment with benefits.
- Other students have been offered summer employment.
- One student has changed his course of study based on internship experience.
- All interns have taken Career Readiness trainings.
- Additional businesses are requesting interns for next year.
- Follow up conversations will be held on April 23 regarding apprenticeships in Surry County.

Obstacles we have overcome:

Funding structures do not allow for innovation.

- We fund 3 college liaison positions locally to ensure all students have support with accessing college classes.
- We have been forced to seek grant funding in order to pay the Career Coach for the Next Generation Career Academy.
- We locally fund textbooks for students who are taking college courses.
- No funding structures for the Surry Virtual Academy courses or principal position.
- We provide transportation if needed. We do not get reimbursement for these miles in the state formula.
- Early Alert System created between SCC/SCS to help HS students be successful in college courses.
- Communication and strong relationships are a key to success.
