

# SUGAR CREEK DEMOGRAPHICS


- K-12 (2 campuses)

- 25 buses covering most of Mecklenburg County





# IMPORTANCE OF BEING MISSION DRIVEN If you don't know where you're going any road will get you there.

### K-8 CHARACTER EDUCATION

- 6 Full-time Character Ed teachers
- Course content is grade and developmentally appropriate
- Scope and Sequence includes:
- Character traits, basic social skills, conflict resolution, drug and alcohol prevention, global citizenship, advanced social skills, Framework for Understanding Poverty, Community Citizenship

## COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS (CCR) GRADES 8-12

- Currently 5 full-time counselors
- Course content grade appropriate
- · Scope and Sequence includes:
- College and career exploration, college planning, financial literacy, ethical decision making, managing emotions and anger, employer expectations, resume writing, ACT Prep, college application preparation, digital citizenship

# 2018 INAUGURAL GRADUATING CLASS "FIRST IN FLIGHT"

- 30 Students
- 100% accepted to 4 year colleges
- One student has already been accepted to 14
- 3 students admitted "early admission" to UNC Chapel Hill
