

NCICU By the Numbers

WE AWARD

1 in 4 Bachelor's Degrees in NC1 in 3 Graduate Degrees in NC

36 Private, Nonprofit Institutions including:

- 5 HBCUs
- 3 Colleges for Women
- 1 Two-Year College

STUDENTS

65,124 undergraduates *52% from NC* **23,197** graduate students

57% from NC

19,073 students received the NCNBS

Almost 50% of our NC students receive federal Pell Grants (\$105+ Million distributed in 2019-20)



NC Undergraduate Enrollment Impact of \$20M Loss in 2011 in State Aid



Increased Challenges to NCICU North Carolina Enrollment

- COVID-19
- \$20M less in State financial aid than in 2011
- Other states offering in-state tuition to North Carolina students
- 1,700 out-of-state institutions can offer online courses in North Carolina
- NC Promise

Legislative Priorities for 2021

- Increase in recurring funding of State Need-Based Aid of \$11m from \$88.9m to \$99.9m
- **\$6m** in non-recurring financial aid for students whose families have been negatively affected by COVID-19 and for COVID-19 expenses
- \$750k to provide a scholarship to North Carolinians who graduate from the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics and attend an NCICU institution
