

1 ESTABLISH GENERAL FUND BUDGET

SECTION #.(a) Notwithstanding G.S. 143C-6-4, the Office of State Budget and 2 Management shall transfer the IT Fund fund codes (27xx) from budget code 24667 to budget code 3 4 14660 in order to establish the Department of Information Technology's operating budget. The 5 Office of State Budget and Management shall also establish a reserve in budget code 14660 for the 6 transfer of IT Reserve appropriation to budget code 24667. The changes authorized by this section 7 shall be completed by September 30, 2016, but are effective from July 1, 2016, and shall be

8 reflected in the base budget for the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium.

9 **SECTION #.(b)** It is the intent of the General Assembly to appropriate funds during 10 the 2017 Regular Session for Department of Information Technology internal service fund 11 overhead costs upon removal of agency costs from the service rate structure, thereby eliminating

12 the use of a subscription fee to agencies.

- 6 Commission on Governmental Operations, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on
- 7 Information Technology, and the Fiscal Research Division.

1 APPRENTICESHIPS AND CAREER-BASED OPPORTUNITIES IN CYBERSECURITY 2 FOR DISABLED VETERANS

3 **SECTION #.(a)** The Department of Information Technology shall create a 4 cybersecurity apprenticeship program to provide training, apprenticeships, and career-based 5 opportunities for disabled veterans within the State. Opportunities may be offered to qualifying 6 veterans who have at least a ten percent (10%) disability rating as established by the Veterans 7 Administration.

8 **SECTION #.(b)** The State Chief Information Officer shall conduct a competitive 9 process to select disabled veterans to participate in the cybersecurity apprenticeship program. 10 Participants will have the opportunity to apply concepts, protocols, and tools acquired through the 11 program by working side by side with experts in cybersecurity within the State of North Carolina.

12 **SECTION #.(c)** Of the funds appropriated by this act for the support of the 13 cybersecurity apprenticeship program, the Department of Information Technology shall select up 14 to five disabled veterans to participate in the program.

1 ADJUST IT BUDGETS AS NECESSARY DUE TO TRANSFER OF FUNCTIONS 2 SECTION #.(a) Notwithstanding G.S. 143C-6-4, the Office of State Budget and 3 Management, after coordination with the Department of Information Technology, the Department 4 of Environmental Quality, the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, and the Fiscal 5 Research Division, may adjust information technology budgets, as appropriate, within the 6 Department of Natural and Cultural Resources and the Department of Environmental Quality. 7 **SECTION #.(b)** All information technology budget adjustments authorized by this 8 section shall be completed by December 1, 2016, and shall be reflected in the base budget for the 9 2017-2019 fiscal biennium. Adjustments may be made only for the information technology 10 budgets of the Department of Environmental Quality and the Department of Natural and Cultural 11 Resources for the purposes stated in this section.

SECTION #.(c) The Office of State Budget and Management shall report any adjustments made pursuant to this section to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Agriculture and Natural and Economic Resources, and the Fiscal Research Division on or before January 15, 2017.

1 ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING DESIGN AND IMPLEMENTATION

2 **SECTION #.(a)** The Department of Information Technology, in coordination with the 3 Office of the State Controller and the Office of State Budget and Management, shall conduct the 4 planning and design of an enterprise resource planning system (ERP) for State agencies by 5 utilizing business process reengineering to identify and organize processes and workflow in order 6 to prioritize and link work activities to realize efficiencies and organize around outcomes. The 7 ERP system shall address, at a minimum, core financial management, grants, assets and inventory, 8 fleet management, and human resource management. A request for proposal for a replacement 9 system implementation shall be prepared for release no later than July 1, 2017. If the funding 10 needs exceed the funds allocated for the planning and request for proposal development efforts, 11 the Department of Information Technology may use savings generated through efficiencies gained 12 through overall Department operations, including procurement, to supplement the project; provided, that the total amount expended for the project does not exceed five hundred thousand 13 14 dollars (\$500,000).

15 SECTION #.(b) The Department of Information Technology, in coordination with the 16 Community College System Office, shall begin planning and design of an ERP for the State's 58 17 community colleges. The ERP system shall address, at a minimum, student administration, core 18 financial management, grants, human resource management, and payroll. A request for proposal 19 for a replacement system implementation shall be prepared for release no later than July 1, 2017. 20 If the funding needs exceed the funds allocated for the planning and request for proposal 21 development efforts, the Department of Information Technology may use funds from the North 22 Carolina Community College IT Systems budget code 26802; provided, that the total amount 23 expended for the project does not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000).

24 **SECTION #.(c)** The Department of Information Technology shall submit a report to 25 the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology on or before January 15, 2017. The report shall identify results from the business process reengineering efforts for State 26 27 agencies and the Community College System and shall include at least all of the following:

"(b) Exemptions. – Except as otherwise specifically provided by law, the provisions of this
Chapter do not apply to the following entities: the General Assembly, the Judicial Department, the
<u>State Bureau of Investigation, the Department of Public Safety, and The University of North</u>
Carolina and its constituent institutions. These entities may elect to participate in the information
technology programs, services, or contracts offered by the Department, including information
technology procurement, in accordance with the statutes, policies, and rules of the Department.
The election must be made in writing, as follows:
